REPUBLICAN CONVENTION.

A republican convention for Linn county is called to meet in the city of Albany on Wednesday, April 9th, 1890, at 10 o'clock a. m. for the purpose of selecting ten (10) delegates to the republican state convention to be held in Portland, Oregon on April 16, 1890, to nominate candidates for the various county offices, and to transact such other business as may properly come before the convention.

The county convention will be composed of 86 delegates, apportioned one delegate at large for each precinct and one for every twenty-five votes or fraction over half that number cast in the precinct for Binger Hermann for member of congress at the general election in June, 1888, as follows:

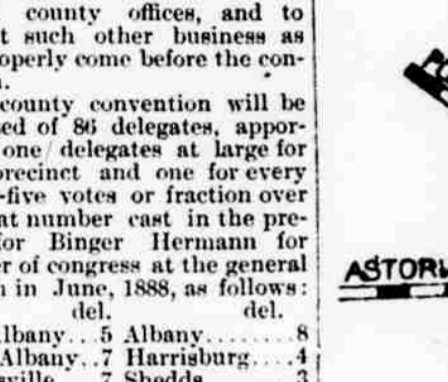
