Oregon Ship-Timber.

In connection with the efforts now being made to protect the forests in the eastern states, it is interesting to notice that while a few years ago the shipment of lumber by the way of Cape Horn to the Pacific coast formed a large part of the carrying trade of American vessels, the situation is exactly reversed to-day as regards direction. It is becoming extremely difficult to get timber in the East for keelons, masts and spars for the large sailing ships now building. Enterprising ship-owners and builders are looking to the Pacific coast for their supplies.
