In Kansas the punishment for murder in the first degree is death, but the order for the hanging cannot be issued until one year after conviction, and it is then made optional with the Governor. No executive has yet been found who is anxious to send to the scaffold men who were probably convicted several years before, so for fifteen years murderers have practically been consigned to life terms in the penitentiary. Of course the ad hoc of the recent endorsement of the death penalty will figure out a vast accession of murders in that state as a result of the new action of her governors, but statistics fail to bear out such a conclusion.

MANY criticisms have been made upon the custom of the United States senate in holding secret sessions, and the universal verdict is against such a practice. The Friend presents about the situation when it says that the press of the entire country of all parties has been clamoring for the secret sessions of the U. S. Senate. We unite with them in this condemnation. Things have come to a pretty pass when the servants

What trading of votes is done, and what schemes are cooked up for robbing the people in these sessions, we cannot divine; but it is a custom that should be universally condemned. This is a free country; we have no use for Star Chamber proceedings. The advocates of liberty, equal justice to all and special favors to none can hear the broadest and fullest light of day upon their proceedings. When a senator cannot represent his people with services open to the scrutiny of all it is time for him to be called home.

The Czar of Russia, in his autocratic fashion, dabbles even in the love affairs of his subjects. He is credited with having broken up the proposed marriage of his cousin, Grand Duke Michael, and the Countess Ignatieff, daughter of the Russian ambassador to Turkey. The young people were devotedly attached to each other, it being a purely love match and the Grand Duke even agreed to resign all political rights and live abroad and yet the match is postponed. If that is the way the old despot carries on business the quicker the nihilists get away with him the better, will be the verdict of all lovers of the romantic ideal.
