ABOUT GAS WELLS.

Talk of Sinking a Well in the Vicinity of Albany. The recent discovery of natural gas wells at Astoria, and in Southern Oregon, has revived the interest in the project of sinking such a well in this vicinity.

Reports from the Drain well have encouraged them in this. A company with a capital stock of \$100,000 is being organized at Drain to develop it.

M. N. Dimmer, the gas and oil expert, who accompanied the party of Portland capitalists to Drain last Saturday, said concerning the discovery: "The quality of the gas is far superior to any I have ever seen during nine years' experience in the gas regions of Pennsylvania and also in Mexico and Russia."

Dr. B. F. Hamell, says that the excitement over the discovery of natural gas is growing intense. "I was called upon to make an experiment with the well," said he, "that was dug last winter. The well was from twenty to twenty-five feet deep, and the water was so offensive that the man who dug it gave up all idea of using it for domestic purposes. It tasted like oil so much that a person could not drink it."
