

THOMPSON'S NARROW ESCAPE.

Accident to a Freight Train at the Balles-Steamship Eastern Oregon Sold.

PORTLAND, April 26.—General Major and party including Mrs. Logan, arrived here at 10 o'clock this morning. They were met at the depot by a delegation from the G. A. R. posts of the city and were driven in carriages to different points. After making a tour of the southern district the party went to the high school building where the teachers institute was in session. The visitors were given seats at General Alger's table. He complimented the institute who were present on their work. As the party proceeded to leaves, Logan took a prominent position and as they passed by spoke and shook hands with all of them. After luncheon the party visited the heights on the cable. In the evening a reception was tendered Alger and party at the tabernacle. Hon. G. P.
