EDITORIAL NOTES.
CYCLONES and hail storms, high
water and destruction rule in the
lower Mississippi country.

SOME of the San Francisco papers
are becoming worried over the
prospects that the new Pacific
lines of railroad are going to de-
stroy the shipping business in the
over competition case.

The English syndicates are still
seeking locations for their surplus
millions. Recently a company of
that kind paid \$1,000,000 in gold
for the Western railway in Buenos
Ayres South America.

The Louisville Courier-Journal
prints an item, which it credits to
the Rio News, to the effect that
the United States government
cannot hope for an extension of
trade with South America in the
face of an attempt to make foreign
trade restrictions more severe. If
the Rio News really printed such
an item its editor must be a
donkey, for of the vast quantity
of merchandise imported from Brazil
—and our imports from that
country exceed in value those of
any other country—the bulk is
free of duty. We are Brazil's best
customer for coffee, and charge no
duty upon it, while the country
from which she brings more goods
than any other, namely, England,
imposes a good round tariff upon
coffee. It is hardly necessary to
add that Mr. Watterson must be-
long to the same breed of econo-
mists as the editor of the Rio News
if he thinks there is a point to be
made for free trade by such ridi-
culous comments.

A REASONABLE proposition has
been presented to congress on the
subject of special-delivery letters.
To secure special delivery for a
letter at present it is necessary,
in addition to the usual postage, to
attach a special stamp, costing ten
cents. The suggestion has been
made that the same result may be
secured by putting on the extra
ten cents in ordinary stamps, at
the same time marking the letter
conspicuously as one for immediate
delivery. There can be no objec-
tion to this, and it would prove
convenient in many cases when the
special stamps are not at hand.

ONE of the most useful and im-
portant governmental institutions
of the country is the coast life
saving service. It is not an old
institution only dating back to
1871, and was started on the coast
of Massachusetts. Johnston says
that the little seed sown by these
men of Cape Cod, fostered by the
Massachusetts Humane Society
and by the National Government,
has continued to grow, until it has
developed into this grand and
noble work, extending, as it does,
along the coasts washed by the
Atlantic and Pacific Oceans, and
the shores of the Great Lakes and
the Gulf of Mexico. The total
number of stations in commission
the year ending June 3, 1888

225-173 on the Atlantic seaboard
and Gulf coast, 7 on the Pacific
coast, 44 on the borders of the
Great Lakes, and 1 at the falls of
the Ohio River at Louisville,
Ky. In the year 1873 the service
was divided into eleven districts,
since increased to twelve. Each
district has its superintendent and
an assistant inspector, who are
subject to the orders of the general
superintendent and inspector of
stations. There is also a board on
life-saving appliances, its object
being to assist the general superin-
tendent in investigating all plans,
devices, and inventions which
may be an improvement on the
apparatus already in use. The
estimated number of lives rescued
and amount of property saved
during the years from November
1, 1871, to June 30, 1889, inclusive,
was: total number of persons
rescued, 42,359; total number lost,
505; total value of property saved,
\$60,352,692. During the year
ending June 30, 1889, from a total
of 3,284 lives involved, 2,688 were
saved. The total value of property
saved by the service for this same
length of time was \$5,054,440.

What a grand showing of a most
humane! The saving of property
is commendable, but that sinks
into insignificance and is lost
sight of when compared with the
rescuing of human life. This
record shows plainly the almost
perfect discipline and manage-
ment of those in charge of this
department of the government, as
testifies to the heroism and fidelity
of the keepers and crews of the
several stations in the scenes of
peril through which they must
necessarily have passed. Each
member of the crew, before being
accepted by the government, has
to present a certificate from a
surgeon of the Marine Hospital
Service, showing that he is physi-
cally sound, and is between twenty-
one and forty-five years of age.

The keeper, in addition to these
requirements, must have an ordi-
nary education and some experi-
ence in the management of surf-
boats.
