

A File of Dead Deer.

To Build Upon the Sands Securely.

From the Builders' Reporter. A process of preparing foundations has been patented by E. Neukirch, of Bremen. Its object is to make loose sand firm and resisting as solid rock. At present the universal method of doing this work is to under water, is to remove all loose material and then make a beton or other similar substructure. The process under consideration, which is only of use where the materials are fairly clean silicious or calcareous sand, aims at consolidating the grains by covering them with a film of cement, which is forced into the spaces between the particles by compressed air, steam or water under pressure. Sheet piles are employed to prevent the spreading of the cement over more ground than is necessary. The system has been largely used in the harbor of Bremen, and is to be tried in preparing dry foundations.
