OREGON AFFAIRS IN CONGRESS.

Congressman Hermann, who is always alert for the interests of the people of Oregon, has been scoring the government for its false system of economy concerning postal facilities and other matters in the Northwest. During a speech on the floor of the house by representative Hermann, on the legislative, executive and judicial appropriation bill, a sharp colloquy occurred between him and Mr. Cannon, the chairman of the appropriation committee, in reference to Oregon matters.

The results of the Pan-American conference cannot be easily estimated. The one achievement of forming the arbitration treaty, which has already been signed by nine of the powers—namely, the United States, Guatemala, Nicaragua, Salvador, Honduras, Bolivia, Ecuador, Peru and Brazil—is the forerunner of universal peace among those nations, and will be ranked as one of the historical achievements of that conference.

To impose great, important and responsible duties upon an officer, and then to disable him from their performance, was neither just to the officer, business-like for the country, nor creditable to the public service. That he had moved, he says, a like amendment when Mr. Randall had charge of the bill, in a previous session, but he found the Eastern mind indifferent to the situation in the West, and unable to comprehend the rapid settlement of the public domain, and the corresponding necessity for liberal appropriations to extend the public surveys.
