EDITORIAL NOTES.

The promise for an abundant yield in the wheat crop, at the present time, is excellent for Oregon, and our leading crop may prove to be a most profitable one this year.

EMPEROR WILLIAM of Germany is talking of visiting this country. He will find open handed hospitality here, with no greater danger menacing him than the pencils of the newspaper reporters.

If Stanley cherishes any revenge in his make up he will have ample opportunity to indulge it if he is appointed governor of the Congo states in making life a burden for the man who circulated the story of his death, and gave him no aid in his search for Emin.

The bill before congress to erect a statue to the memory of Gen. Stark in New Hampshire is very properly not likely to pass. The matter of erecting statues may be all right, but if the general government does that kind of business it should place the statue in the national capital and not in the state.

The report that Judge R. S. Bean, of the 2d judicial district, who is a candidate for supreme judge, had resigned his circuit judgeship, as sent out by the associated press dispatches, was premature, as he has not yet resigned. While Governor Penney is in the executive chair it would be useless for Judge Bean to resign for if he did, and a special election notice was published to fill the vacancy, probably Gov. Penney would appoint all the same—a railroad commissioner, and thus very materially complicate matters. The resignation will come in just as well after the election.

Some of the strange events that transpire in politics is related in the fact that a cobbler named Schwenzel, and a socialist in boot, has just become a member of the Prussian "Herrenhaus," or House of Lords. At Zandwitz, near Ratibor, in Silesia, there exists a tiny feudal barony which confers upon its holder the dignity of knight and a seat in the Upper Chamber of the Prussian Parliament. Until recently it was held by Baron Nathaniel Rothschild, of Vienna, who possibly by way of response to Emperor William's anti-Semitic expressions and policy, has sold it for the sum of \$145 to the cobbler in question. One of the seigniorial rights of the estate is the nomination of the pastor of the little town of Zandwitz, and of the four schoolmasters at that place and at Klein-Peterwitz. The newly fledged nobleman and member of the House of Lords, has just filled these posts reserving for himself the most highly paid of the school-masterships.

The project of the London engineer, to open the much sought after northwest passage by the use of dynamite, thus breaking up the

ice and opening a ship canal—as it were—from the Atlantic to the Pacific, is as visionary as the projects of flying machines. An exchange says that Jules Verne in his fiction or some other intrepid traveler on paper make use of the scheme proposed by the prominent civil engineer of London, but that was only as a temporary expedient and not as a permanent thing. Scientists say that a slight divergence in the direction of the earth's axis would cause a redistribution of the ice which now clusters about the poles. Why would it not be easier for our prominent London engineer to collect a large quantity of high explosives, say at Greenland, discharge them all at once and thus shake our Mother Earth out of her perpendicularity and change the location of the ice caps? Such a plan would be much quicker in its operation than to blast a channel through the ice to the North Pole, and possible spite as possible. But it makes one's teeth chatter to think that crazy scientists may take a pocket full of dynamite up to Baffin's bay, some fine day, and knock the earth out of balance and in a twinkling send us all into the Arctic regions to freeze. Such suggestions should be incarcerated at once.

The legislation upon the silver question in congress is progressing, and the present session may enact a bill that will be in a measure satisfactory to the country. It is asserted that there is a clear majority of the house in favor of free coinage, though it is not probable that so radical a measure as a free coinage bill will be passed unless the gold men become too persistent in their opposition to any legislation in favor of the silver metal, in which case the silver men may take the matter into their own hands. And further it is said that, judging from the tenor of recent discussions it would seem that some bill providing for the purchase and deposit of \$4,000,000 or \$4,500,000 worth of bullion per month, with a restriction upon the power of the secretary of the treasury to resell more than a fixed amount of his purchases, and the conferring of full legal tender quality upon the treasury notes issued for the purchase of the bullion, would be very generally satisfactory, for the silver men would probably accept it as a long step toward the adoption, ultimately, of free coinage.

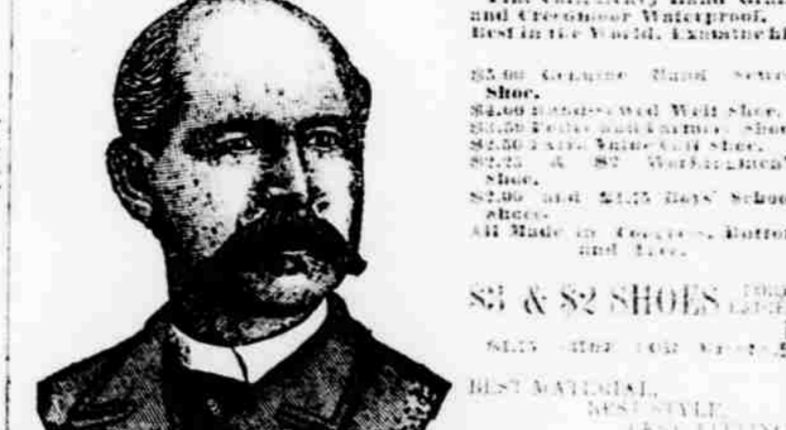
