The tendency to consolidate among railroads is being constantly augmented. The Northern Pacific has absorbed other lines until it now practically reaches from ocean to ocean. Now the Canadian Pacific has made traffic arrangements with the Watash lines which takes it into Chicago. The consolidation of roads will go on until a few large corporations will control the whole.

What genuine workmen can do was demonstrated yesterday in London, when 150,000 men turned out in a great procession. There was no disorder, and, in striking contrast to the scenes of May day, the police did not interfere with the demonstration. It was estimated that a half million people were in and around Hyde Park. Such a proof of what workmen can do when they are united in a great cause has not been furnished in London for a quarter of a century. It assures the success of the eight-hour movement in England.

Probably the Chronicle, in making the allusion to the project of crossing the buffalo with our domestic cattle, makes a statement that is the absolute truth of the matter. The man who has secured a lease of islands in the Great Salt Lake and an appropriation of \$300,000 to cross the buffalo to common cattle has worked a very neat little game. The preservation of the buffalo is a worthy object, but it is rather late to begin now, when the animal is practically extinct. As for crossing the buffalo with domestic cattle, this scheme can only be in the interest of the boarding-house keeper who wishes to improve upon the toughness of the long-horned Western steer and thus secure an indigestible steak.

EMPEROR WILLIAM of Germany is using every effort to induce the German Reichstag, to increase the army, the French being so much larger than the German that it gives him an uneasiness to con-

templating the prospects. He is essentially a warrior in feeling and sentiment, but the force of the times will finally convince him that wars are really an end and arbitration will settle national difficulties. The constitution of the empire, however, only allows 1 per cent of the population to be conscripted annually, and this limit has already been reached and the Reichstag cannot if it desired to grant the imperatives of the warlike emperor.

The decision of the United States Supreme court upon the Iowa prohibition case, which reverses the decision of the Iowa supreme court, and declares the seizure of sealed packages of liquor sent from Illinois into Iowa unconstitutional, will render not only prohibition null and void, but will affect many other matters. The fact is often stated the clause of the constitution giving congress power to regulate commerce among the states has been the occasion of numerous judgments of the supreme court which have not been at all points harmonious. At least two of Marshall's most famous opinions were rendered in actions brought under that clause, and from one of them the decision rendered on Monday draws support, while at the same time it dissents from an opinion delivered in a similar case by Taney. Coming down to our own time, eminent authorities have firmly believed that the Interstate Commerce Act was unconstitutional; and in general it is safe to say that in no class of cases is the view which the supreme bench will take more entirely a matter of conjecture. In the present instance the court is not unanimous, but the dissenting opinion is held by only three of the nine judges. It is an interesting circumstance that Justice Brewer, whose nomination to the supreme bench was violently condemned by Kansas prohibitionists and whose confirmation was strenuously opposed by them, dissents from the majority and believes Iowa law to be constitutional.
