BETWEEN THE FIRES.

One of the least progressive countries in the old world is Turkey, poor old Turkey that is always trying to negotiate loans to keep up its credit, and furnish a revenue to keep up the Sultan's harem.

Russia is anxious to gobble up the entire domain, and the rest of the nations are as anxious that she shall not for fear that thereby her supremacy may be established to the detriment of the others.

Recently the Sultan has been greatly worried and it is said that for ten days the gates of the Imperial palace have been kept closely guarded and all ingress and egress prohibited.

These precautions have been adopted in consequence of the threatening attitude of the leading Ulema, or priesthood, who decline any longer to countenance or tolerate the innovations and reforms which the Sultan is striving to inaugurate.

Fourteen years ago they deposed his eldest brother, Murad, on the pretext that he was mentally afflicted, solely because he had manifested his intention of transplanting western institutions to the soil of the Ottoman Empire.

And of cutting himself free from the fetters to which the rulers of Turkey are condemned by their fanatical priesthood. For although nominally the power of the Padishah is autocratic and his will supreme, yet his edicts are required to be in strict accordance with the precepts of the Koran as interpreted by the Ulema, who unite in their persons both ecclesiastical and legal attributes.

According to the terms of the treaty of Berlin of 1878—an international compact which alone prevented the absorption of vanquished Turkey by victorious Russia—the Sultan bound himself to execute a number of reforms in connection with the internal administration of his Empire.

Indeed it was solely on this condition that Western Europe undertook to intervene in behalf of his monarchy. Since then repeated remonstrances have been addressed to him by the signatory Powers of the treaty on his failure to carry out his promises.

Anxious as Abdul-Hamid undoubtedly is to keep faith with those who championed his cause in 1878, and to avoid any pretext for Muscovite aggression, he naturally finds it difficult to achieve within the short space of twelve years the transformation of an Asiatic society into one of a European character.

Moreover, he sees his efforts in that direction obstructed at every point by the Ulema, who realize that the adoption of western innovations and culture will necessarily diminish their power and influence.

They have therefore issued a protest against his entertainments and hospitalities to foreign monarchs and princes visiting Constantinople, and have denounced as contrary to the precepts of the Koran many of his recent acts—notably his foundation of an Imperial school of sculpture and painting.

They declare that a "restoration of the old regime" can alone conduce to the greatness and prosperity of the Empire. The Sultan is therefore between two fires. If he fails to hasten the promise reforms, he is in danger of seeing his Empire absorbed by Russia and her confederates; while if he attempts to execute them, he incurs the peril of deposition by the Ulema—and deposition in the Orient means death.

He was made the subject of arrest and incarceration in prison while there, because some drunken students saw fit to ascribe—falsely—

that he had expressed remarks derogatory to his majesty King William. No explanations would suffice and his only recourse was to wait patiently until they saw fit to discharge him for insufficiency of evidence.

The conclusion of the public, upon the Sandy Olds murder case in Portland, will most certainly be that some very potent influence must be brought to bear in his favor. Very few persons procure the benefit of four different trials for the same crime. Probably he will never hang for the crime he has committed, and to save expense the next jury should make the verdict something less than murder in the first degree.

All sorts of means to be employed to hinder the enactment of any tariff reform measures. The latest in that line being the report that the European powers would enact retaliatory laws if the McKinley bill is passed by Congress. Probably our congressmen are trembling in their boots over the fear that such a dire calamity will happen, but all the same they will vote for the McKinley bill.
