THE CAR STOVE MUST GO.

The expression of public opinion upon the subject of the stove in railway carriages has been that it is dangerous to remain in use, and therefore it must go.

This view of the matter has been brought about by the terrible accidents that have been caused by the fire in cars arising from the stoves setting fire to the demolished coaches after general smash ups and the overturning of derailed cars.

Recent experiments on eastern roads show that steam from the engine as a heating agent is far superior to any other system in use. It has been shown that the engine of a long train can supply sufficient steam to heat the cars without interfering with its traction power; that the temperature can be regulated satisfactorily—that is, to everybody except a few cranks who always find a public conveyance too hot or too cold; and that the steam can be cut off from one car without interfering with the supply for the rest of the train.

The question of heating railway trains by steam has passed beyond the sphere of experiment into that of demonstration. Proof of this, in further proof were needed is supplied by the fact that one important company, in its desire to keep abreast with the times and give its passengers the best there is to be had, has adopted a system of steam-heating.

The statistics prepared in reference to the use of steam in passenger cars are full of significance and promise. About one-fourth of the entire passenger rolling-stock in the country, including baggage and sleeping cars—7,391 cars in all—is now equipped for steam heat. On 8,466 miles of railway all the passenger trains last winter were heated without stoves, and companies controlling 82,978 miles of railway have at least begun to equip their cars with the new system. The reports of eighty-one companies show that steam-heating has been, on the whole, very successful, and that many difficulties feared when the system was first introduced have not proved serious in practice.

The state of New York was instrumental in bringing about this result by placing a law upon her statute books compelling the use of steam in heating heating passenger coaches.

REPUBLICS are said to be as apt to be without gratitude as any of the old monarchies, and in some cases it is almost apparent that such is the fact, but mainly republics remember services and munificently reward. One of the cases of remission appears, according to all reports, in the case of the aged mother of Lieutenant Cushing who gained renown through his gallant action in blowing up the Albatross during the rebellion. It is very truly said that if the mother of Lieutenant Cushing be really in want the government should do something for her to show its recognition of the services of her brave son, whose deeds were never sufficiently rewarded. The blowing up of the rebel ironclad Albatross is admitted by competent naval critics to be an exploit unparalleled in the war for nerve, daring and skill. Cushing then a beardless youth, was exposed to a murderous fire while he guided the torpedo to its place and pulled the lines that exploded it. This work required the nicest calculation, as a premature explosion would have caused little damage. He escaped by a miracle, his clothes being riddled with bullets. It was service which should have insured him immediate promotion, but he died shortly after, still a lieutenant, though he had done more good work in his brief life than many a rear admiral performs in a half century of service.

It is thought, probably of the trouble growing out of adjusting the present census business it is remarked that the census of the City of London, which is probably the most accurate taken in the world, is completed in an hour, and that hour between 11 and 12 at night. It may be stated, however, that the police are not expected to obtain the entire family history of each citizen or to inquire minutely into his physical and financial condition.
