Last week a crowd of a dozen or so men went up from Brownsville to work on the Calapooia trail to the mines. It is the intention to put this trail through to the mines on the head of the Calapooia this fall.

The Umatilla Indians have enjoyed a rare bonanza in picking the wool from sheep in Morrow, Grant and Umatilla counties, that gave up the ghost to the storms of last winter. Thousands of pounds of such culms fleeces have been purchased by wool merchants this season.

The matter of getting gas at Drain seems to be a matter of prospect, and is progressing with more and more favorable indications. Boring will continue until the well is 100 feet deep unless gas or oil is reached. It is now thought that something will be struck before half that depth is attained.

Mr. Miller, reader of the house of representatives, was a caller at the Gazette office Friday. He said that he had authorized that the Union Pacific is about to secure control of the Oregon Pacific, and that that road would rush it through to Boise this season if it does get it. He says the Southern Pacific has not yet captured the Oregon Pacific and from pointers he received a few days ago, that company will not get it. Should the Union Pacific secure that road it will let them into Portland one day sooner than by the route they now travel.—Malheur Gazette.

So far as the Yaquina Republic can learn there is no ground for the rumor that there has been a change in the management of Oregon Pacific road. It seems almost certain that work on the eastern extension of the road will soon be commenced. The others of this road are not prone to telling their plans to the public and pursue their business in their own way and time. They have built their road so far on this plan and surmounted great difficulties. The Republican has faith in the ultimate outcome and that sometime in the future the Oregon Pacific will be one of the great roads of Pacific coast.

The temporary bulk head placed in the basin at Oregon City while repairs were being made, and which held the steamer Three Sisters a prisoner, was removed last evening, and the steamer came out late last evening or will come out early this morning. She will go to Portland to fit up, and will arrive in Albany about noon on Saturday on the way to Corvallis. Future trips are not decided upon.

THE NAPERVILLE INJUNCTION CASE

TO THE EDITOR OF THE HERALD: Please allow me a little space in your paper in order to point out the deception, once more, in the Naperville injunction case.

In the HERALD of July 10th there appeared an article taken from the "Evangelical" the "minority sheet" claiming to be the decision of Judge Smith. And in the HERALD of July 15th I published an answer to the above so-called decision, giving the decision of Judge Smith in its legal form as it is recorded upon the records of the court, my object was to protect my readers from the deception on the part of the "minority" in publishing the private opinion of Mr. Smith and not giving your readers any part of the decision of the court.

And now comes Mr. J. Bowersox, and in referring to my answer, calls it "A Mistake, a Mistake, a mistake." He, Bowersox, says, "Dubs in his paper issued June 12 closed the article of Judge Smith's decision with this paragraph, viz: 'The court decides that the injunction shall remain, but it ought to be attended with a bond.'"

Now, this Bowersox, Dubs, and their "sheet" would palm off as the decision of Judge Smith.

The following is the decision of Judge Smith in its legal form, and is so entered upon the records of the court, once more.

"AT CHAMBERS, JUNE 3, 1890. 'The Hon. C. W. Upton, Judge of the 12th Judicial Circuit, having requested me to hear the motion to dissolve the injunction heretofore issued in this cause, and having fully heard the matter it is ordered that the motion to dissolve the injunction is over-ruled, but it is further ordered that complainants give a good and sufficient bond in the sum of two thousand dollars, in 10 days to be approved by the clerk of the Circuit Court of Du Page county, and upon failure to give such bond there in that court this injunction shall stand dissolved.'"

"C. B. SMITH. Your readers may now judge for themselves whether the "Evangelical," Dubs and Bowersox, have given the decision of Judge Smith, or I who am defending the church. And although the injunction was not dissolved in this case, nevertheless a great majority of the congregation, more than two-thirds, recognize and worship with the loyal pastor who was appointed by Bishop Escher, while on a furlough with the minority pastor and too in the same church, so they, the minority have gained nothing, only that the loyal trustees are enjoined from prohibiting the minority man from preaching in the church until general conference shall order otherwise.

Perhaps some of your readers will ask, out will the general conference order otherwise? Your dear readers may judge from the following: The Evangelical association consists of 24 annual conferences. Twenty-one of the 24 have strong majorities in favor of the church, and not a few of the 21 are unanimous and solid loyal to the church, and have by strong resolutions spoken in plain terms on this question, sustaining Bishop Escher and Bowman, declaring the so-called trial conferences and suspension of these two bishops illegal and a farce, hence every sober-thinking man can see what will be the complexion of the next general conference. Yes, there will be an overwhelming majority in the general conference against this wicked rebellion, brought about by the leaders of the minority party in our church, since there are only three annual conferences out of the 24 that have a majority in favor of this rebellion.

Permit me to point out another fact. It is not generally known by people who are not members of our church that the minority party is preparing to organize a new denomination, and many of our people even are yet in the dark on this point, but their secret plans and shameful deception are becoming known more and more. A number of our people all over the church are getting their eyes opened and are leaving their ranks. Even two preachers in

the Des Moines conference, who at the late conference session went off with the seceders and ignored Bishop Bowman, have come out in the Evangelical Messenger of July 8th in a public statement declaring they have been deceived, but now that the secret plans of the minority party are becoming known, and finding they are organizing a new church, these two men have publicly asked to be reinstated, etc., wishing to remain with the Evangelical association.

Now this "minority" element in the church have a perfect right to organize another church if they think another denomination is needed, and if they are not willing to submit to the majority of the church and her regulations, let them, like honest men, withdraw and organize; but they have no right to deceive the people.

I could give many more facts that would open the eyes of the people, but my article is getting too long, so will let this office for the present. I wish it to be understood that I am only defending the church. I should not have written a line for the paper had it not been that the "minority" sympathizers have published such deceptive articles, which needed correcting.
