A RECOUNT ORDERED.

St. Paul and Minneapolis to be

Re-enumerated.

WASHINGTON, July 26.—

The secretary to-day ordered a

re-enumeration of St. Paul and

Minneapolis. Prior to issuing this

order the secretary had received

from the superintendent of the

enumeration a letter detailing the

trouble regarding the count of

the two cities, the results of an

investigation made by his bureau.

In it he says in part, "Evidence

shows that the census schedules

are fraudulent and can be
