EDITORIAL NOTES

CHENATOWN in Portland is up in arms, and another bloody high-binder riot is feared.

CANADA is imposing a tax of \$6 a barrel on importations of American pork, an article needed largely in excess of the home ability to produce.

The initial number of the Seattle Telegraph has been received. It is a full-fledged morning newspaper, and gives evidence of coming to Seattle to stay.

The bellicose republics of Central America continue their tilting and threats of war. One good fire company of the United States could march down across the border and silence the whole lot of blow-hards by turning the hose on them.

The effective method of the ducking stool was tried upon a wife beater in Empire, Nev., and it is probable that the effect will be salutary. Next to the lash a good, sound ducking is the best punishment for the brute who whips a woman.

The enormous development of our iron industry is shown by the statistics of the Iron Age, in which the production of iron for the first six months of 1890 is placed at 4,610,000 tons, which is the largest amount of iron ever made in any country in the world in that time.

The Oregon editors have been spending a few days very profitably and pleasantly in Portland. It is to be hoped the meeting of the state Press Association in the metropolis will result in the elimination of some of the senseless antagonism existing between Portland and the interior portions of state.

THE Rev. J. W. Army, of Saranac, Mich., will be given the choice by his congregation between his pulpit and his fast horses. This preacher, like many others, has a fondness for horseflesh, but he did not confine himself to the road, but insisted upon entering his horses for races; hence the wrath of his church, which will be apt to land him in the same limbo once occupied by Adirondack Murray.

KANSAS CITY, Kas., has made phenomenal strides in ten years, advancing from a ragged, straggling border town of 8000 people to a well built city of 38,170. But its growth has been no greater in degree than that of Omaha or Buffalo, although the percentage seems enormous because it had so few people to start with, which is one reason why the percentage system is so misleading.

WHILE the public debt is decreasing in the United States the reverse process is under way in Canada. In 1867, at the time of the establishment of the dominion, its debt amounted to \$22 per head of the population, and that of the United States debt, on the same basis, is about \$15, and that of the dominion \$48. That is to say, while the per capita indebtedness of the United States is only a quarter as great as it was twenty-three years ago, Canada's is more than twice as large as it was then.

THE population claims made by the advocates of Idaho and Wyoming, when they were candidates for admission into the Union, scarcely held out with the census figures. Superintendent Porter says that the rough count in Idaho gives that state 80,000 people and Wyoming 60,000. Had these figures been known during the debate on the admission of these states some votes might have been

withheld from them by Easter republicans. It was claimed by them that they had a population of 125,000 each. It is more than likely that in such mountainous countries many people have not been counted.

The influence of the United States constitution is clearly recognizable in the new Brazilian document, as it has been in almost every republican constitution adopted during the past one hundred years. The Brazilian constitution provides for a president and a vice-president, to be elected by an electoral college; two branches of the national congress and a supreme tribunal whose members are appointed for life. The capital is to constitute a federal district like the District of Columbia, but with the additional privilege of representation in congress and the choice of presidential electors, as any state, and the old provinces become self governing like our own states, suffrage restriction being placed on those only who are illiterate, mendicant, private soldiers, or members of religious orders. Religious liberty is guaranteed, and there will be no legal connection between church and government. The document seems so singularly broad and wise in its provisions that Brazil may be congratulated on escaping a reign of political adventurers and attaining so speedily at least the nominal dignity of a modern state.
