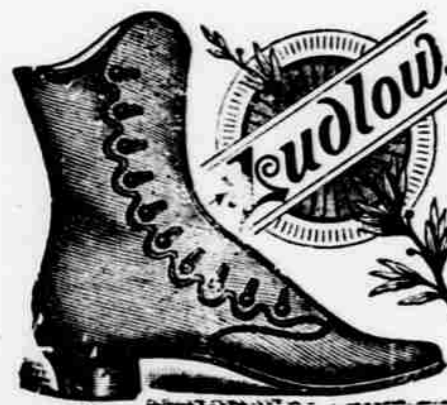

## A CENSUS RIOT.

Bogus Enumerator in Minneapolis Causes Great Excitement.

TALK OF TAR AND FEATHERS.

A Preacher Wrongly Accused of Immorality Causes Severe Conventions.

MINNEAPOLIS, August 28.—The cases of the six enumerators charged with conspiracy to falsify the Minneapolis census, were before United States Commissioner Odell at 10 o'clock yesterday afternoon. There was a good deal of excitement over the case, and an attempt to incite a mob to tar and feather the United States Attorney Baxter and Deputy Marshal Daggett. Baxter considered Commissioner Odell so badly biased on account of being himself a Minneapolisian that he refused to prosecute, but issued a new warrant returnable before Commissioner Morley, of Winona, at St. Paul. This raised the ire of the defense, and Hart, as spokesman, turned to Baxter and said with flushed face:

"Am I to understand that the legal representative of the department of justice sanctions this infamous attempt to carry these boys over to a St. Paul jail?"

"This action," replied Baxter, quickly, "is taken under the express direction of the department of justice at Washington, received by me yesterday."

"Then let us tar and feather him," said Hart, turning to the crowd, which applauded him, but made no move to act.

Commissioner Odell sat pale and motionless, and did not utter a word to rebuke the incendiary address of the attorney.

Baxter finally refused to present the cases, and transferred to some other court room, and Odell refused to adjourn until the prospects are that it will be in session all night. Six deputy marshals, heavily armed, are in the court room, in case a mob should attempt to break in to haul the district attorney.

**SOUTH DAKOTA REPUBLICANS**

Adopt a Platform and Nominate a Governor and Two Congressmen.

MITCHELL, S. D., August 28.—The republican state convention assembled this morning. The platform endorses the Harrison administration; asks the government to assist in the establishment of irrigation; demands the expansion of currency; favors protection, endorses the disability pension bill and the Anti-Allen ballot system; pledges the party to the strict enforcement of the prohibitory law.

The convention re-nominated Congressman Pickles and substituted John Gamble, of Yankton, for Congressman Gifford. Governor Mellate was also re-nominated by acclamation.

**A Preacher's Suicide.**

GREENSBORO, Ga., August 28.—Rev. W. A. Overton, one of the most prominent Baptist ministers of the state, committed suicide

by shooting himself in the head.

He was found by a neighbor in the woods near his home, and was taken to the hospital, but died before he could be removed.

## KING OF THE TURF.

Salvator Makes the Wonderful Time of a Mile in 1:35 1/2.

STATE AND COAST NEWS.

A Farmer's Mysterious Disappearance from Salem—The Washington Democratic Convention.

MEMPHIS, Aug. 28.—Salvator today in an attempt to beat 1:35 1/2 made a mile in 1:35 1/2. The bookies made Salvator a favorite, laying 1 to 2 against him, while 8 to 10 was laid that he would not break the record. There was a big plunge on Salvator and his price fell to 1 to 9, while 2 to 1 was laid against him. Some bookies laid 4 to 5 over or under 1:35 and did a large business. There was a long over and when Salvator finally appeared, accompanied by Rosette and Namona, pacesman, a loud cheer went up.

Slowly the trio cantered up the stretch and in a few minutes only a cloud of dust marked their progress to the starting point, where Caldwell and half a dozen others were waiting them. Salvator and Namona went rear a furlong past the point, leaving Rosette behind. Namona went off in front and was ten lengths past the starting point before Salvator reached it, going at a hot pace. When the half past was reached he had distanced her, and making a rapid stride after Rosette, who had just been started. She was very speedy for a few furlongs and made a splendid pace-maker for Salvator. The people at the grand stand who had watched her were amazed at the wonderful speed. The quarter was made in 23 1/2 and the half in 47 1/2. Salvator had not tired and so went 1 1/4 in the three-quarter mile and a furlong further before going in the stretch. He set a new record for a mile in 1:35 1/2 and a one-mile race in 1:35 1/2. The time was a fine record and indicated that the new horse was a real winner, and when he finished he was so tired that he fell on the ground.

COLUMBUS, O., August 28.—Of the four men to be executed at the prison annex to night between 12 and 6 A. M., Elmer Sharkey, of Preble county, married, has been reprieved to September 29th, and Isaac Smith, of Pike county, murdered, to October 24th.
