A FIRE AT OREGON CITY.

The Chief House Rarely Escapes Being Totally Consumed.

PORTLAND, Sept. 8.—For the fourth time this season the Chief house at Oregon City was treated to a fire yesterday morning. About 9 o'clock a blaze was seen to issue from the roof, and the fire department was immediately called. Before the boys could arrive on the scene, however, the destroying element had secured a firm grip upon the roof. A couple of streams were soon playing upon the flames, which were confined to the upper story. The work of subduing the fire occupied almost two hours, but the greater part of the building was saved. A large amount of damage resulted from water falling upon furniture and carpets. The total loss will not be over \$2,500; partially insured. The building is owned by Colonel White.

A Spanish Execution.

MARZO, Sept. 8.—Higinia Bala, the Spanish murderess, was garrotted here for the murder of Marchioness Valera, widow of the wealthy landowner of Cuba. Her death, which created a deep and lasting sensation throughout Spain, occurred on the night of July 1, 1888, her maid, Higinia, and Dolores, a young woman of bad repute, being the perpetrators. The latter was sentenced to seventeen years' penal servitude.

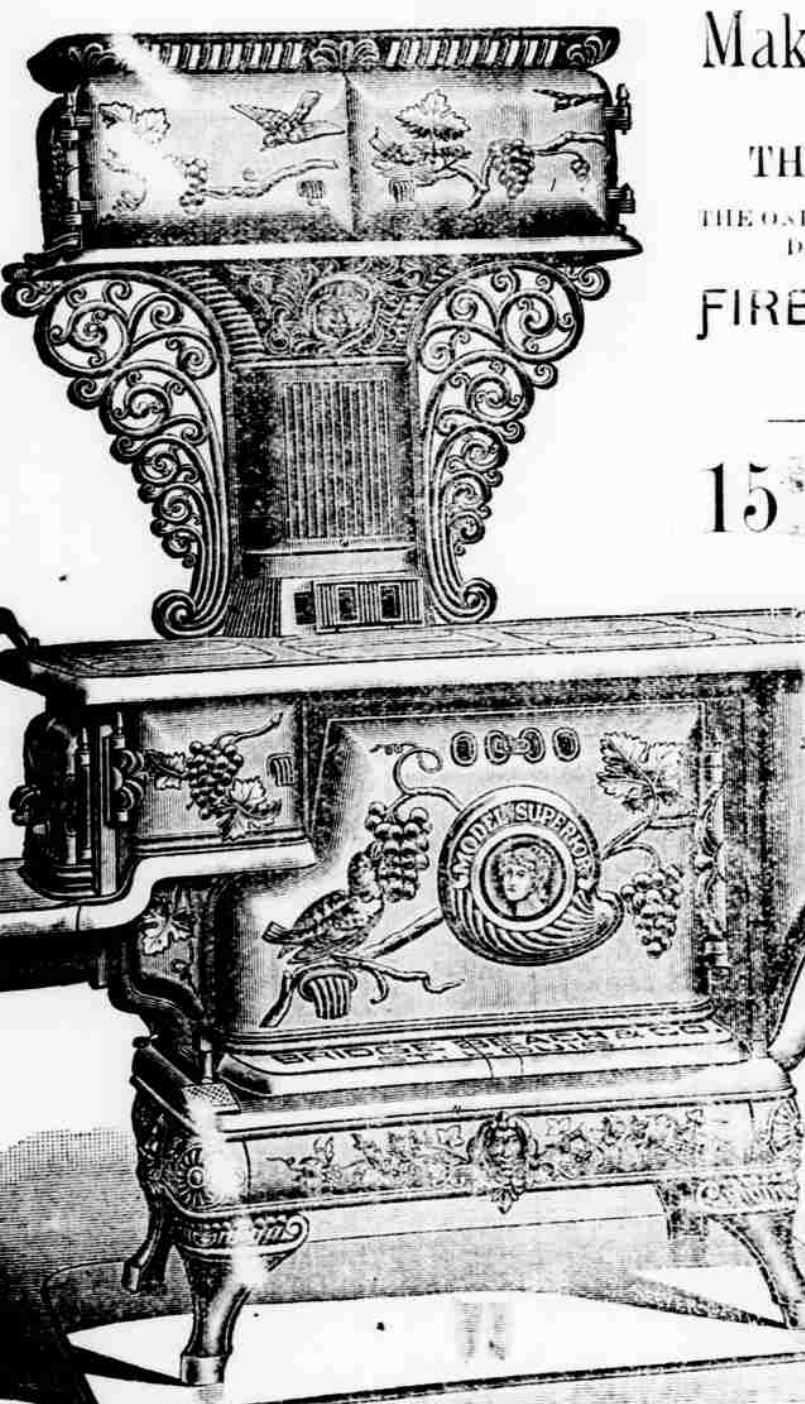
