THE FLEETWOOD ACCIDENT.

She Will Read Law—Eyrand's Memoirs—Saved from a Paper's Grave—Commissioner Platt.

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 11, 1890.—The trial of W. B. Taylor, who was indicted by the February grand jury for cruelty while mate of the American ship St. Paul, took place today in the United States District court. The evidence adduced went to show that Taylor had struck several members of the crew and was very conclusive. Taylor offered no defense but that of denial, and he was the only witness. The jury returned a verdict of guilty and Taylor will be sentenced on Friday.

SAN SALVADOR.

Some of the Canadians Do Not Like Our Flag, Others Do.

PREACHING AND RACING.

Senate Work Planned—Depw Gives the Strikers No Sympathy—Six Wives Lost and Died.

SAN SALVADOR, Sept. 11.—The city has taken on a holiday appearance. National hunting flows from every residence and the business houses and streets are crowded with people who have come from every quarter of the republic to be present at the opening of congress to-morrow. That body will convene its sessions in the National theater. One of the first acts of congress will be the election of a president to fill the unexpired term caused by the death of Menendez. Ezeta is the most popular candidate, and his election is considered sure. Dr. Ayala, vice president under Menendez, and also set up the government on the borders of Honduras, is in Guatemala, but his best friends believe he stands no chance of being elected by the Salvadoran congress. Salvadorans claim that he is a traitor and is ineligible to office. He is President Barrios' chief rival for president, and this has cut off all his chances, if he ever had any.

CHILDREN STOLEN.

The Restor Is Jilted By the Millionaire's Daughter.

MURKIN VS. VOORHEES.

Promises One and Marries the Other—Davit a Home Ruler—Gladstone's Son—Not Accept the Invitation.

KANSAS CITY, Sept. 11.—An audacious plan which contemplated the wholesale kidnapping of children for ransom, was reversed to-day when the grand jury found a true bill for that offense against Henry C. Wilson, who keeps a lively stable. The plan was to kidnap people of wealthy parents, connect them to some secret place in some distant state and keep them there until their ransoms should be paid. Wilson took for an accomplice the coachman of Mrs. Jeff Dunlap, a wealthy widow living on McJee street. Mrs. Dunlap's 3-year old boy was to have been the first victim, and then the 4-year old boy of James H. Arnold was to have been kidnapped. After these two had been kidnapped, others were to have been kidnapped. The plan was all laid out to kidnap the Dunlap boy, when the coachman weakened and confessed his part in the contemplated scheme to Mrs. Dunlap, who informed the police. When Wilson went to the vicinity of Mrs. Dunlap's residence last Saturday to carry out the first part of his plan, an officer placed him under arrest, and to-day the grand jury indicted him.

DON'T LIKE OUR FLAG.

The Mayor of Toronto Orders it to Be Torn From a Flagstaff.

TORONTO, Sept. 11.—When the industrial exposition was opened yesterday by the Earl of Aberdeen, a very handsome United States flag was fluttering from one end of the grand stand. Upon noticing this, the Earl, who is of the Canadian militia, ordered the flag to be taken down. This was done amid a good deal of hissing and cheering by those who noticed the act. As soon as Manager Hill, of the exhibition, heard of the occurrence he ordered the flag to be again hoisted, and this morning it was again in place. Mayor Gray appeared upon the ground boiling with rage, and ordered the "flag of an alien people" to be torn from the flagstaff. This Manager Hill refused to do, claiming to be as loyal as the mayor, and beside he said it was only a graceful compliment to the American people who every year visited the exhibition in large numbers. The question will come before the board of directors to-morrow for decision.

THE WORK FINISHED.

Washington Legislators Adjourn and Members Go Home.

OLYMPIA, Wash., Sept. 11.—The reapportionment bill, which passed the house with but five dissenting votes and the senate with but three, presented to Gov. Ferry, who was at the capital this morning. He promptly affixed his signature, and when the enrolled bill was sent back to both houses they adjourned.

Mayor Poud was elected temporary chairman and Thomas J. Haynes temporary secretary. Committees were appointed and a recess taken. No sympathy from Depew.

NEW YORK, Sept. 11.—A committee of five of the strikers waited on Depew to-day to talk over the recent strike. He told them their places had been filled by Mr. Webb and it had been approved by the directors.

GLADSTONE DECLINES.

The Great Liberal Leader Says He Cannot Cross the Atlantic.

OTTAWA, Sept. 11.—For a long time the liberals of Canada have been endeavoring to persuade the great leader of the English liberal party to visit the Dominion. In declining a recent invitation to cross the Atlantic, Mr. Gladstone writes: "I regard with the greatest interest, the condition and progress of Canada. I had to do with her affairs officially when she was in the trammels of the administration from Downing street, and I belonged to a cabinet which prepared the act and formed a plan for the erection of the Dominion. But I cannot hope to see that great territory, for my age, and still more, my engagements, utterly disable me from crossing the Atlantic. I shall be glad if you will make this known to all such as may feel an interest in the matter."

HE DIED IN POVERTY.

But a Friend Saved His Body From a Pauper's Grave.

NEW YORK, Sept. 11.—Luere, husband of Mme. Camille Ursa, saved the body of Auguste Sauret from being buried in a pauper's grave. Sauret a few years ago was recognized as one of the greatest pianists of the world, but died in extreme poverty. He had often been on the Pacific coast. Luere found the body just as the corner was about to deposit it in a pauper's grave and had it decently interred.

WRITING MEMOIRS.

That is What the Ferocious Eyrand Is Doing.

PARIS, Sept. 11.—Assassin Eyrand has lately been relieving the tedium of his imprisonment by writing his memoirs, which one of the wardens, who is a good draughtsman, has illustrated. Several sensational incidents have thus been depicted.

WIRE CLICKINGS.

A Kentuckian in Buffalo has discovered the term of Irish and English. What is considered especially remarkable about the firm is that Mr. English is an Irishman and Mr. Irish is an Englishman.

In Philadelphia the police made a wholesale raid on the Chinese gambling house on Race street and captured 225 players of fan-tan. So the law is being spread over the eastern cities as well as the cities on this coast.

Mary Herbert and Marie Brown, daughters of prominent residents of Pleasantville, N. J., fought a prize fight in a sixteen-foot ring, pitched in an old barn on the outskirts of that village, at 3 o'clock on Sunday morning. The cause of the fight was rivalry for the attention of a young man named Geo. Woodward. Thirty-eight rounds were fought, in which both girls were severely punished, but neither had the advantage, and the combat was declared a draw. The combatants were stripped to the waist. Every part of their bodies exposed to view bore traces of punishment. The referee, seconds and spectators were all female friends of the principals. Woodward has since declared he will have nothing to do with either of the girls.

WILL TRY TO BE A LAWYER.

NEW YORK, Sept. 11.—Clara Bella McDonald of San Francisco, has arrived in this city and is preparing to make her readings here. She says that she will study law. The first law college for women in the United States is to be opened in New York city in fall and she expects to take the lectures. She has consulted with a successful lawyer and she will read with him.

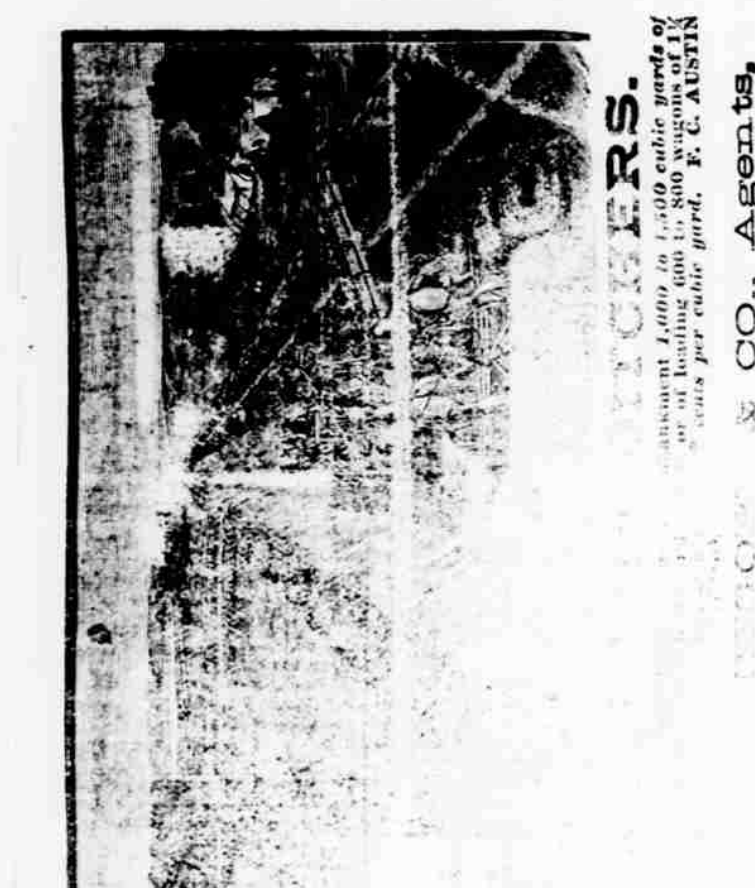
