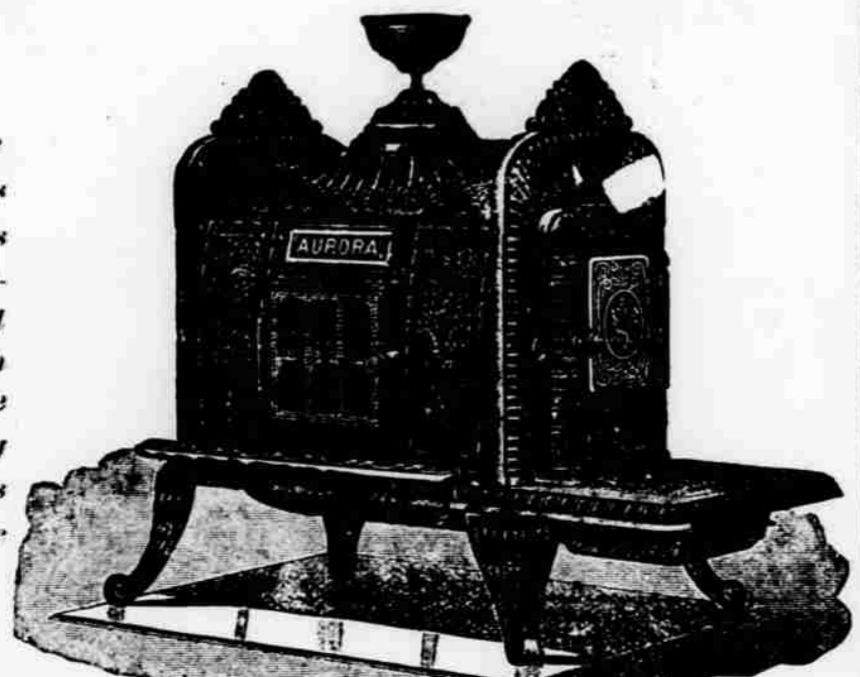

KILLED HER FATHER.

An Inhuman Wretch Who Deserved a Terrible Fate.

BORN AFX, Oct. 15.—

This city was horrified to-day by a domestic tragedy. A policeman named Perqueret was shot by his own daughter, a girl of 18. In order to spare her mother's feelings the girl had kept her terrible secret and tried in every way to avoid going into her father's presence. At 10 o'clock this morning, while her mother was out, Perqueret met his daughter. A terrible struggle ensued, and the girl managed to catch a loaded revolver which was hanging with some other weapons on the wall of the room. Then she turned and fired it point blank at her father, who fell dead on the spot, a bullet having passed through his temple. Later on the girl went to the police station and gave a full account of the affair. As soon as the news leaked out, the people almost went mad with horror, and strategy had to be resorted to by the authorities in order to convey the body to the morgue without its being attacked.

Overdue Vessel Arrives.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 15.—The British bark Inch Keith, 151 days from Hamburg, yesterday brought information that the Tacoma, long overdue from New York, was still afloat.
