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THE TARIFF AND WOOLEN MILLS

There seems to be the greatest divergence upon the question of the effect of the tariff upon the product of the sheep, than upon any other line of work in American industries.

Why there should be any question upon the subject, it is difficult to understand, for it is one of the plainest and best understood questions involved, as it reaches the largest numbers and is a practical application that any producer can figure out for himself.

Yet very many figure out as did a recent correspondent of a California paper, who asserted that the most of the woolen factories in that state had to go under because of the tariff; that the Pioneer Woolen Mills could not continue in existence under protection; that a mill in Woodland, Yolo county, had to go out of business and sell its plant at a loss; that California wool is good for nothing but to manufacture shoddy out of, and that we must have imported Australian wool to mix with it.

The Chronicle hinted up the matter, and gives from a letter from a practical woolen manufacturer of that state in reply to the assertions referred to, which may be summarized as follows:

The going out of business of the Pioneer mills had nothing to do with the tariff, since those mills needed only California wool for the class of goods they made. The Woodland mill did not go out of business, for they never had started in business, the subscriptions not having been filled by several thousand dollars. The Napa mills, the Petaluma mills and the Golden Gate mills, the Petaluma and Golden Gate mills have all increased their capacity, and are running to full time. The San Jose mills, the Merced mills, the Stockton mills and the Marysville mills are running to their full capacity and cannot supply the demand.

As to the quality of California wool, our correspondent says we have some of the best wool in the world, and the most desirable for manufacturing purposes in every good quality, including strength and elasticity of staple. It is excellent for spinning, is porous and will take the most delicate colors. It is fine in staple, the merino predominating, and is in all respects excellent wool.

This is the answer of the practical man to the theorist. It needs no comment, unless it be to say that this is the usual result of free trade and protection discussions. The free trader is very degenerate until the protectionist attacks him with the logic of facts, and then his defeat is swift and disastrous.

It is a generally recognized fact that this is an age of advertising. But a certain young woman who is rapidly getting rich by writing novels which no careful parent knowingly permits to come into his or her residence, is a point or two ahead of the smartest actor on the road in her methods for obtaining free advertising. She came to Washington several days ago and after writing her name on the register of one of the swell hotels she added in big round letters the word "novelist," which with two strokes of the pen was enclosed in the blackest of brackets, thus making it the most conspicuous thing of the page. The result of course was several paragraphs in the local papers mentioning the young woman and also, her novels.

The World's Fair Commission in one respect seem to have an adequate conception of the importance of their position. Their conception rests in the fact that

they fully understand that it requires a princely salary to maintain the dignity of the offices, and no matter what a shortness there may be in the coin for the actual expenses of the exposition, the appropriation must be applied to the salary business. Probably that arrangement will be highly satisfactory as the visitors to the exposition can look at the high paid officials if there is nothing else to see, sort of a "wax finger" show.

WEATHER prophets are plentiful in all localities. They are full fledged here as well as elsewhere and are already busy upon the winter predictions. In the east they are very active, and the Tribune says that the ever-engaging prophets who know just what sort of weather we are going to have reappeared. It is next winter that naturally engages their attention. It is going to be cold, next winter is, sure. Crabs are plenty, and many crabs mean much bitter weather. One of the prophets was asked the other day what was the connection between crabs and a thermometer below zero. He replied: "I never reason when I know a thing is so." Good for him! We always like to see a prophet who has the courage of his predictions.

The express companies are said to be considering the question of increasing the rates upon freight carried by them. The particular call for such an action it is hard to discover, for certainly the rates have been high enough all the time. Probably they take the action simply because they can. That kind of thing will not last always however.
