THE SILVER QUESTION.

The agitation of the silver question continues to be one of the topics of interest. The Washington Post says that silver down in the neighborhood of 135, and selling in Washington on Friday slightly below the New York quotation, and over 1,000,000 ounces offered of which only 200,000 could be taken to complete the October purchases, there would seem to be something of a disposition on the part of holders to unload, especially those who had speculative accounts to settle. To 105 is certainly a big drop from 121 1/2, the highest point which silver reached on its first spasmodic scramble for 129.25, or parity with gold, and it is not a pleasant fall to contemplate for those who bought at 114 1/2 on the 1st of October, nor for speculators generally who look, but look in vain, to see prices stimulated by the government's purchases. The latter, it may be remarked, aggregate 11,777,500 ounces since the new law went into effect, and was resumed on the 1st of November for the current month. In the meantime there has been an accumulation of about 10,000,000 ounces in New York, bought up on an expectation which will materialize nobody knows when, if ever. Of this amount the sum of nearly 7,000,000 is stored in the vaults of the Merchants Safe Deposit Company, and costs the owners 2 cents per ounce per day for storage, to say nothing of the interest on the money put into investment. At present quotations, 112 1/2 being the average price paid for this silver, it is estimated that the holders are about \$700,000 worse off than when they went in. The caprices of the silver market have thus far baffled all ordinary calculations, and the speculators who undertook to corner it have only succeeded up to date in getting themselves into a corner. The developments during this month will be awaited with a good deal of interest.

The courage and devotion of women has been the subject of wonder and admiration during all the ages of the earth, and well it may be for in all the annals of history the heroic self sacrifice of women forms a conspicuous mark in the record, and if the incidents of unwritten history could be made known, the number of courageous and heroic actions would be greatly multiplied. One of these incidents recently transpired in Lima, Peru. Dr. Nicholas Pierola, ex-president of Peru, had been put in jail on charges of disloyalty and also on a charge of being responsible for the loss of the last few battles of the war between Bolivia, Peru and Chili. While awaiting sentence the privilege was given his family of dining with him on Sunday. One Sunday his wife, accompanied by her children, came as usual to the prison. The jailer did not notice that she looked a little more robust than usual and that she carried a small basket. She remained for supper under the plea of illness. At 7:30 the children were led out by a person whom the jail officials thought was the wife of the prisoner. At 8 o'clock the jailer came to Pierola's cell. The prisoner was in bed. At daybreak the next morning all the prisoners turned up except Pierola. His cell was visited and his wife was found snuggled up in the bed-clothing. By this strategy he was liberated and escaped to this country.

It is stated in a foreign exchange that a new aluminum process, known as Mauseier process, is being introduced in France. It comprises three stages, desulfuration,

reduction, and liquation. The desulfuration is effected by fluorine or fluoride of calcium, at a high temperature in presence of carbon. Lime or the carbonate of potassium or sodium may be added to facilitate the desulfuration. The reduction is obtained by means of iron and manganese raised to incandescence in the presence of carbon. The liquation, or separation of the aluminum from the iron and manganese, is effected by dropping the molten mass into carbon ingot molds.

GRAIN from New York to English ports is said to be carried for one dollar per ton, it being taken as ballast on passenger steamers.
