THE OREGON PACIFIC.

The Company to Be Re-organized and the Road Pushed Eastward.

The people of Oregon and especially those of the Willamette Valley and Eastern Oregon, are deeply interested in the future of the Oregon Pacific railroad, and the movements of the company are watched with interest by the public.
The cause of the road being placed in the hands of a receiver recently was on account of default in payment of interest on bonds due October. The petition was signed by parties holding \$1,500,000 of the bonds, who selected Mr. Hogg to represent their interests. The West Shore is authority for the statement that the company will be re-organized and placed on a solid financial basis and the work of extending the line will be resumed at an earlier day.
The original intention was to build from Yaquina Bay, Oregon, to Boise City, Idaho, a distance of 600 miles. The line is now completed from the initial point to a distance of 140 miles from Yaquina and 60 miles eastward from Albany, and is being operated the entire distance. It will be refreshing news to parties holding time checks and other obligations of the road to know that at last there is a prospect of a settlement being reached. The line has labored under difficulties from the day it was started, caused principally by attempting to make \$50 to \$100 worth of construction work. A good business awaits the completion of this road, and it is to be hoped the new management will be able to carry the enterprise to a successful completion in a creditable manner.
