Manager Mueller Notified.

After making a finding in the matter of Lake Labish wreck and locating the cause of the disaster, Oregon's board of railroad commissioners forwarded the following letter to Manager E. Koehler, of the Southern Pacific's Oregon line.

Dear Sir: The board herewith sends to you a copy of the findings in the matter of the wreck of train No. 16 at Lake Labish. In view of the facts developed by this investigation, establishing the faulty condition of the structure, the board therefore recommends that the same be repaired in a thorough manner throughout in all particulars, which the findings indicate as defective.

The rights of those entitled to lands under the treaty are being infringed upon by those coming in and claiming tribal relations, but who are not of any of the tribes on the reservation. There seems to be a determination on the part of Indians to see those persons, whom they believe to be interlopers, put off the reservation.

There came so near being another terrible passenger train wreck on the Southern Pacific Saturday between Salem and Portland that every passenger on the north-bound local that day was justified in congratulating himself when he saw how narrow the escape from death had been. As the train was speeding along at New Era, and neared the trestle, the engineer brought the train to a sudden stop. And he applied the air brakes none too soon, for, imprisoned on the high trestle less than ten feet in front of the engine, was a horse. Had the train run into this animal the likelihood is that there would have been another awful accident, for at this place the trestle is probably forty feet above terra firma, and the train might very easily have been overturned. It was a fortunate and a narrow escape. Ten feet is little distance between safety and a train wreck. —Statesman.
