THE SALEM DISASTER.

Tax Oregon Board of Railroad Commissioners have concluded their investigation of the recent railroad disaster at Lake Labish, near Salem, and filed their report. They find that the railroad's theory of a rail having been removed is not supported by the testimony, and the further find that the bridge was faulty in many particulars and not sufficiently strong to sustain the weight of moving trains under such conditions as are likely to present themselves on any railroad at any time.

This decision, affirming in effect the verdict of the coroner's jury in the case, should be of great benefit to the traveling public, since it must impress upon the Southern Pacific Company the fact that it is better economy and better judgment to spend money in construction than in paying damages. It has been known for a long time that the Lake Labish bridge was not in proper condition, but the railroad company very unwisely preferred to take chances, and now in all probability it will have to pay the cost of a new bridge several times over in damages to those injured in the disaster.

It is the duty of the company to look to these weak spots, and it is probable that it will do so now, not because of any greater sense of its obligations to the public, but because the Lake Labish casualty has alarmed the patrons of the road, and will cause a diminution of business unless steps are taken at once to put bridges and trestles in first-class condition.

Even as good a man as Elijah Halford, the courteous and accomplished private secretary to the president, is sometimes compelled by the exigencies of his position, and circumstances, to resort to telling a "white fib." For instance in answering a communication from the Woman's social science club of Brooklyn, New York, asking Mr. Harrison to nominate that distinguished and well advertised female jurist, Belva Lockwood, to the vacancy on the bench of the supreme court. Mr. Halford wrote that the request would be considered by the President, when he knew that it would not be. It is harder to go through the eye of a needle than to be the president's private secretary and always tell the truth.

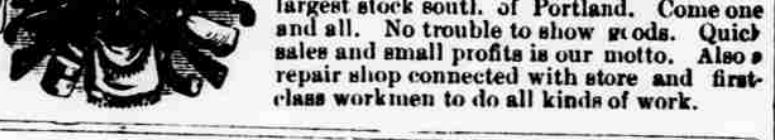
