THE THEORIES OF MICROBES.

The new science in the medical practice, based upon the theory of the microbe foundation of disease,

The discussion of this subject elicits many important facts and disseminates much useful knowledge.

The theory of vaccination to prevent smallpox and of inoculation to cure hydrophobia is that the introduction of a disease germ into the body of the patient that disease in a modified form, and that the material in the body fitted to develop such a disease is that used, or so that when the more violent of the disease appears it has nothing upon which to feed, and is harmless.

The new theory is based upon newly-discovered real antagonism between disease germs that results when they are brought into contact in the natural destruction of each.

The son of a Russian doctor was attacked by diphtheria, and finally his case was pronounced hopeless.

When death seemed imminent, however, the patient was attacked with erysipelas. For a time he was worse, then recovered completely.

His father, the doctor, was somewhat puzzled by the turn of affairs, but suddenly the facts of the case struck him, and he began the cultivation of erysipelas germs, with which he inoculated diphtheria patients with startling success.

The doctor claims that the erysipelas germ attacks the diphtheria germs, and that the result is their mutual destruction.

There is no cause for alarm regarding the financial situation. The only element of danger which has seriously threatened the stability of things has manifested itself from the other side of the Atlantic.

So far as regards the condition and prospects of the banks throughout the country, there is nothing in the outlook which need cause any apprehension.

The derangement and depression are not likely to be felt far beyond the arena of the stock exchange.

For the time being, dealings in railway shares will be attended with considerable risk, although in advance along the whole line in the near future is inevitable.

But whether this depression be long or short, the stability of the banks as a whole will not be affected.

This was the experience in 1884, when the situation, so far as concerns the stock market, was much like that which prevails at present.

The banks, however, are in better condition than they were in then. As compared with that time, their reserves are greater, their affairs are being conducted with more conservatism and intelligence, and they have had a longer period in which to prepare for any strain which could present itself.

The banks of the country were never stronger than they are at this moment, and there is nothing in sight or in prospect which could threaten their solidity or offer a serious menace to general business.

The Prime Minister of Australia now suggests the forming of an Australian nation; the movement for Home Rule in Ireland is daily growing stronger, and leading Canadian newspapers advocate annexation with the United States.

If England wants to avoid trouble from all these scattered dependencies, it might give them up voluntarily and confine its government to the "right little, tight little island" in the channel.
