### A WHOLESALE SLAUGHTER.

The Plain Straws With Dead Redskins Troops Farming to Remain in the East.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 30.—The commission of Indian affairs this morning received the following report from Agent P. E. Royer, dated Pine Ridge Indian Agency, Dec. 29: "On Monday, Dec. 23, this morning, white soldiers were dispatched to the Pine Ridge reservation, a light look being made on the killing of two Indians and several soldiers including Captain Wagner, with a number of wounded. The soldiers and party were camped on White Clay creek just below R. I. Clark's house, and opposed the boarding of the Indians, who were returning to the reservation. The soldiers returned the fire, killing two of the Indians and wounding several others. Two soldiers and his band have retreated in a westerly direction from the agency. It is supposed that he is trying to make his way back to Bad Lands. "Four of the Pine Ridge Indians have taken no part in the war, but the Big Foot, Slow Bear, Kicking Bear and Two Strike bands have been and are active in the disturbance. "Secretary Tanager continued with the present in the morning regarding Indian matters, in the presence of all details regarding yesterday's engagement, the secretary declined to talk about it. He said, however, that inasmuch as General Miles had been given ample authority to do as he saw fit in the matter, it was not necessary to say anything in any particular directions. He has decided that no act is necessary today at this end of the line.
