Notice to Electric Light Consumer.

Going to the great loss in "Burn Outs" of the incandescent lamps on the Westinghouse circuits, it becomes necessary for the Electric Light Company to either charge for lamps as burned out or advance the rate. Therefore, consumers will take notice that after January 1st, 1891, the rate on 16-cp lamps burned until 9:30 p. m. will be charged \$1 per month as a base rate, in place of 50 cents as heretofore, for each lamp, and judges lamps in proportion, and lamps burned a later hour than 9:30 will be charged \$1.50 for a 12-cp lamp and \$2 for all night, same as the present price, and consumers will be charged paying for a 50-watt lamp and letting their lamp burn all night or a later hour than contracted for, will be charged accordingly without further notice.
