

BALLOT BOX FRAUDS.

REPORT OF THE OHIO INVESTIGATING COMMITTEE.

COLD WEATHER IN EUROPE.

Much Suffering Caused Danger from Hoards in Germany.

LONDON, Jan. 12.—Throughout Great Britain intense cold weather continues. The continent is suffering from snowstorms, so severe that several express trains between Hamburg, Cologne, Berlin and Vienna are snowed up. Mails have been considerably delayed throughout Europe.

Berlin, Jan. 12.—atmidday Emperor William drove a sleigh over the river Havel to Potsdam. The ice was thirteen inches thick. The severity of the weather is causing wolves to become dangerously hungry.

Paris, Jan. 12.—The Seine and other French rivers are frozen. The harbor of Genoa is frozen over for the first time since 1830, and all navigation is stopped.

NEEDS AMENDING.

How Ingenious Lawyers Shield Murderers from Punishment.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 12.—In the senate to-day Vest introduced a bill to repeal the act amending section 761 of the revised statutes, so as to appeal to the supreme court and made an explanation

in regard to it. He referred to the case of the Japanese murderer, Jugurio, sentenced to death by electricity, an appeal in whose case was denied by the supreme court. He said the attorney for the prisoner has applied for another writ of habeas corpus to the same court, and claimed that he could bring up an appeal on a writ of habeas corpus as often as he could find new ground of application. The judge before whom the last application came held that he was not called to grant an appeal to the supreme court wherever the grounds alleged are different from those formerly presented. So appeals to the supreme court would be during the prisoner's natural life and would be only limited by the ingenuity of his lawyer. The bill was referred to the judiciary committee.

Tanner Challenges Sued.

CLINTON, Mo., Jan. 12.—Dr. H. S. Tanner, the man who was famous so long for having fasted forty days, now lives on a farm eighteen miles southwest of this city. He now challenges Signor Sued to sit down with him in Chicago, during the World's fair, to test the matter in ninety days' fast on water only, or if Sued prefers, to let the fast continue from day to day till one or the other yields.

Johnstown Threatened Again.

JOHNSTOWN, Pa., Jan. 12.—On account of heavy rains last night the river rose rapidly this morning and at noon the river was still going up at the rate of six inches an hour, causing considerable alarm, as a heavy gorge of ice is likely to come down in any time.

Opposed to Free Coinage.

NEW YORK, Jan. 12.—The chamber of commerce to-day adopted a resolution opposing the free coinage of silver.

THE LEGISLATURE.

Joe Simon Captures the Presidency of the Senate.

T. T. GEER ELECTED SPEAKER.

Both House of the Oregon Legislature Organize Without Delay—Complete List of Officers.

SALEM, Jan. 12.—The sixteenth biennial session of the Oregon legislature assembled in the capitol at 10 a. m. to-day. The preparatory work of the organization of the two houses appears to have been thoroughly and effectively done, as the caucus work was promptly made, when Hon. Joseph Simon, of Portland, again exhibited his firm grip on affairs.

As soon as the result in the senate caucus was known the house caucus speedily carried out the programme by deciding that Mr. Geer, of Marion, was the major speaker of the house. The coalition does not suit all, but the prospect of any considerable friction is not apparent, and legislation promises to be actively enacted.

The foreshadowing of the world is not yet prominent enough to be read with certainty. Some decided action upon the assessment laws seems certain, and the railroad commission law will be amended without doubt. Judging from the number of applicants for the position of commissioner there will be no thought of repealing the law. Some measure of power will be given to the commissioner, and the number reduced, possibly, making only one, to be elected as are the other state officers, hereafter.

The personnel of the two houses impresses the observer with the belief that they are a capable, earnest set of men and will devote themselves to the work before them with promptness and good judgment.

The caucus of republican senators was held at 11 o'clock. On the first ballot Simon received 14 votes, Moore 7 and Tongue 1.

IN THE SENATE.

The senate was called to order at 10:15 a. m. by Hon. Joseph Simon, of Multnomah, who moved that Senator E. A. Moore, of Columbia county, be elected temporary president. The motion was carried and Senator Moore took the chair, and in a few remarks announced that the senate was ready to proceed to business in a temporary organization.

O. P. Miller was chosen to act as temporary secretary. On motion a committee of five senators was appointed on credentials. The chair selected Senators E. B. Eakin, of Lane; D. McKay, of Multnomah; J. W. Norval, of Union; J. C. Carson, of Multnomah, and C. Cogswell, of Lake. Cogswell declining, Senator Raley, of Umatilla, was chosen in his stead.

On motion Hon. C. B. Watson was chosen to act as assistant temporary secretary. On motion of Carson, the senate adjourned until 2 p. m., to give the committee on credentials time to report.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The senate was called to order by Chairman Moore, and the report of the committee on credentials was adopted.

Cogswell moved that Sherman county be included in the Wasco and Gilliam representation, carried.

The secretary of state was invited within the bar to administer the oath of office to the senators. Carson offered a resolution that the senate proceed to elect permanent officers, beginning with president.

Moore placed in nomination Senator Jos. Simon, and Senator J. H. Raley, of Umatilla, was placed in nomination on the part of the democrats. The senate then proceeded to elect the president. The result was Simon 21, Raley 7.

Tongue and Raley were chosen to escort Mr. Simon to the chair. Mr. Simon took the chair and made a speech of thanks for the honor bestowed on him.

The secretary of state then administered the oath of office to the new president.

O. P. Miller, of Clackamas, was elected chief clerk; assistant, H. Watson; reading clerk, J. B. Eakin, of Lane; sergeant-at-arms, M. Pomeroy, of Columbia; gatekeeper, J. H. McCormack, of Marion.

Cars moved that the president be authorized to appoint two pages and a mailing clerk; carried.

Eakin, of Lane, offered a resolution that the rules of last session be adopted as the rules of this; adopted.

The officers were then sworn in. Hatch, of Polk, offered a resolution that the clergy of the state be

asked to open the day's session of the senate; carried.

Adjourned till 10 a. m. Tuesday. IN THE HOUSE.

The house was called to order a few minutes before 11 o'clock by J. T. Geer, chief clerk of the last session, who announced that the first thing in order was the selection of a temporary chairman.

Mr. Blundell nominated E. C. McCoy, of Sherman, who was chosen by a viva voce vote.

R. B. Riays, of Tillamook, was made temporary chief clerk, and Frank Davey, of Marion, temporary assistant clerk.

C. E. Moore, of Benton; A. C. Jennings, of Lane; J. S. Richey, of Umatilla; W. D. Stillwell, of Tillamook; and C. S. Tustin, of Grant, were chosen a committee on credentials.

On motion of Paquet the house adjourned until 3 o'clock.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The report of the committee on credentials was adopted and the secretary of state swore in the members.

Paquet, Blundell and Crook were appointed as a committee on permanent organization. The committee reported the order of election which follows:

For speaker of the house Paquet nominated T. T. Geer, of Marion. E. P. Coleman, of Lane, was nominated by Butler, of Polk; Geer received 40 votes and Coleman 19.

On taking the chair Geer returned his thanks for the high office. He thought 40 days was too short a time, and believed in working long hours and losing no working days. He thought too many bills are introduced and that work should be concentrated on new measures.

A resolution by Paquet that the secretary of state furnish the members with Hill's code and the session laws and journals of the last session was adopted.

Armstrong offered a resolution that the Salem ministers be invited to open the morning session with prayer; adopted.

Resolution that the secretary of state furnish 200 two-cent stamps and 100 one-cent newspaper wrappers to each member; adopted.

Reporters by resolution were extended the privileges of the house. Four newspapers were voted for each member and officer.

THE BEHRING SEA DISPUTE.

The Controversy Comes Up in the U. S. Supreme Court.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 12.—The Behring sea scaleries controversy came up in the United States supreme court to-day, on a motion which has in view the judicial determination of the dispute between the United States and Great Britain over the seal fisheries. Judge H. C. Cole, in behalf of Thomas Henry Cooper, owner and claimant of the British schooner Hayward, which was seized in the waters of Behring sea by the revenue cutter Rush, petitioned the court for a writ of prohibition, to direct the judge of the United States in and for the territory of Alaska, restraining him from proceeding with the condemnation and sale of the vessel. The object is to have the court to take up and pass upon the question of jurisdiction over these waters.

Justice made an order giving the attorney general two weeks to file an answer, giving reasons why the petition should not be granted.

MILLIONS FOR PENSIONS.

All the Surplus Cash in the Treasury Required to Pay Them.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 12.—Secretary Windom is authority for the statement that the growing treasury surplus can not now be used to purchase four per cent, for the reason that it will be needed for pension payments next month, aggregating \$25,000,000. The available net cash surplus is \$18,000,000, but by the continued excess receipts over expenditures it will probably reach the required amount by the time indicated.

The secretary says the business of the country would be improved by making these pension payments monthly instead of quarterly, and he has made a recommendation to that effect. If this is done, he says, it will do away with the present necessity of keeping a large sum of money in the treasury vaults for three months, when it is just as well in the hands of the people entitled to it.

Simply Justice.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 12.—Representative Kelly, of Kansas, to-day introduced in the house a bill to pay federal soldiers of the late war the difference between the value and face value of money received by them for their services, and to authorize the secretary of the treasury to use enough money to meet the requirements of the act.

THE INDIANS YIELD.

They Are Coming In and Promise to Surrender.

THEY ARE CLOSELY GUARDED.

General Miles Is Suspicious of Treachery and the Situation Is Most Critical.

St. Louis, Jan. 12.—A Post-Dispatch special from Pine Ridge Agency reads: General Miles determined this morning not to parley nor confer again with the Indians, and this morning he sent a messenger to the hostiles' camp at the mission, stating his terms. He said they must come to the agency in small squads and go into camp on the grounds near the friendly Indians. He would not object if they chose their own camping grounds, but the Brules and Oglalas must not camp together, and they must submit to the laws governing the reservation and to the agent. It is learned from official sources that this is General Miles' final action. If the Indians don't accept these terms Miles will go after them and there will be a fight sure.

Father Jule came to the agency last night and brought news of the arrival of Indians at the mission. He informed General Miles that the Indians are in a friendly mood and inclined to come in peacefully. He said the chiefs would be in the morning, and there is a possibility that terms might be made. The general is desirous to receive them and Short Bull, Kicking Bear and Little Wound will confer with him to-day. Father Jule says the Indians do not want to be disarmed. This is the keynote of the conference. If General Miles says they will not be disarmed, peaceable settlement there is no confidence in their peaceful pretensions. All day yesterday they were shooting at the agency along the line of march. They burned their shacks, destroyed their own property of every kind, and they are anxious to know what the whites are going to do. The whites are known to go to war.
