According to the Tribune the clearing house exchanges for the full year at twenty-one cities outside of New York which have made returns for ten years show a gain of 10.6 per cent. over 1889, and 65.2 per cent. over 1880.

The same paper further says that the last two months cannot safely be ignored. Owing to them it happens that the mercantile failures were greater in actual amount of liabilities in business, and in ratio of defaulted liabilities to amount of all business transacted, than in the last quarter of any previous year.

The Tribune further says that the cotton industry remains active, and the building of new mills is in progress, notwithstanding the low prices of goods. Cotton has advanced an eighth during the week, though receipts at the ports and the quantity coming in slight during December both exceeded the record for 1889.
