If we as sume that the total weight of the ship, 1,350 pounds, is only that of outside sheathing, allowing nothing for frame-work, machinery or other inside structures or contents, the weight of the sheathing is only about 0.11 pounds per square foot. As aluminum weighs about 13½ pounds per square foot 1 inch thick, this would make the thickness of the sheathing only about 0.008 inch, or say No. 33 Lewis M. 


