Notice to Electric Light Consumer

Owing to the great loss in "Burn Out" of incandescent lamps on the Westinghouse circuits, it becomes necessary for the Electric Light Company to either charge for lamps so burned out or advance the price of the same. Therefore, consumers will take notice that after January 1st, 1891, the rate on 16-cp lamps burned until 9:30 p. m. will be charged \$1 per month as a basis rate, in place of 50 cents as heretofore, for each lamp, and larger lamps in proportion; and lamps burned after 9:30 will be charged \$1.50 for a 16-cp lamp and \$2 for all night, same as the present price; and consumers contracting and paying for a 16-cp light and letting their lamp burn all night or a later hour than contracted for, will be charged accordingly without further notice.

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
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
