Notice to Electric Light Consumer.

Owing to the great loss in "Burn Outs" of incandescent lamps on the Westinghouse circuits, it becomes necessary for the Electric Light Company to either charge for lamps so burned out or advance the rate. Therefore, consumers will take notice that after January 1st, 1891, the rate on 15-cp lamps burned until 9:30 p. m. will be charged \$1 per month as a basis rate, in place of 80 cents as heretofore, for each lamp, and larger lamps in proportion; and lamps burned a later hour than 9:30 will be charged \$1.20 for 12-cp lamp light and \$2 for all night, same as the present price; and consumers contracting and paying for a 9:30 light and letting their lamps burn all night or a later hour than contracted for, will be charged accordingly without further notice.
