The weight given to circumstantial evidence is often wrongly applied. The Chronicle illustrates this by the case of the college professor whose disappearance was finally accounted for by the finding of his dead body. It says that the clearing up of the mystery of the disappearance of Professor Bancroft of Brown University shows how easily dates and incidents may be confused by persons of fairly good memory. At the time the professor suddenly dropped out of life one of the theories was that he had clandestinely left home for some foreign country, and color was given to this theory by the testimony of several persons who claimed to have seen him in Providence the day after he left. Now it is certain that he threw himself into a pond a few hours after he walked out of his own door. It is such errors in recollection as these which make circumstantial evidence so dangerous.

The law makers of the state of Kansas, are passing railroad legislation of the most stringent nature. A maximum rate bill has been passed which reduces freight, it is said, 20 per cent. This can be counted as the direct result of the arbitrary action on the part of the railroads themselves. By refusing to acquiesce in the reasonable demands of the people, they have caused such a reaction that the matter has swung to the other extreme, and now the railroads are to be unduly cinched. One sided legislation is all wrong but the railroad people have had it so long on their side that they can not grumble much if it vibrates over to the other extreme.

Annual School Meeting. Notice is hereby given to the legal voters of school district No. 5, Linn county, Oregon, that the regular annual school meeting of said school district will be held on the first Monday, being the 2nd day of March, 1891, at the hour of 7 o'clock p. m., of said day at the court house in the city of Albany, Linn county, Oregon, in said district, for the purpose of hearing the reports of the directors and clerk of said district, and to levy a tax for the support of the schools for the ensuing year. Also for the purpose of levying a tax for the purpose of paying interest on the bonds of said school district and the second installment of the principal of said school bonds, due and payable June 15th, 1891, and for the transaction of any other business that may legally come before the meeting. 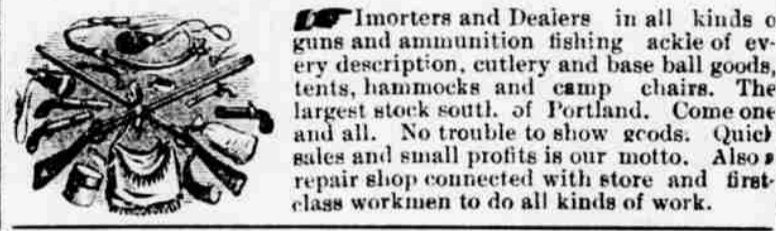

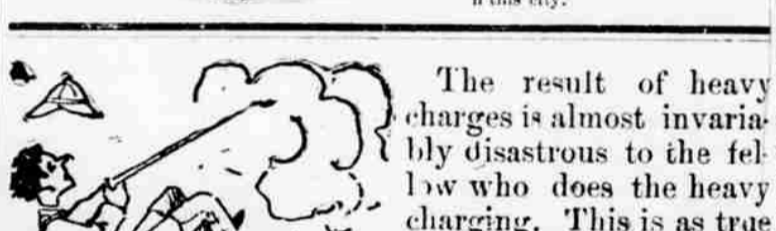
