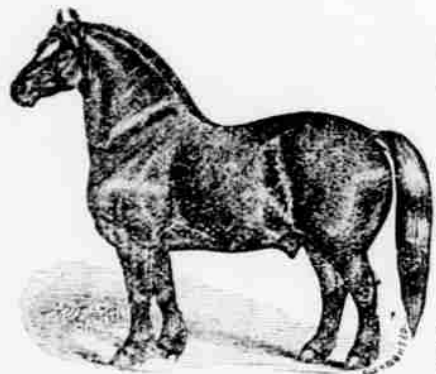

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IMPORTANT DECISION.

Decided That Indians Are Not Separate Nations.

STOUX FALLS, S. D., April 28.—Judges Shiras and Edgerston, in the United States court, rendered a decision on the question raised by the defense in "Plenty Horns" case, disputing the jurisdiction of the court because war existed between the government and some Indians, when Lieutenant Casey was killed. The court denied that the Indians had a right to go to war and affirmed that they were not a separate nation but upon the same level as Americans, subject to the laws made by congress.

Anaconda Mines Sold.

BUTTE, Mont., April 28.—It is reported here to-night that the Anaconda mines had been sold to the Rothschilds.

It is said that President Aeser, of the Baltimore Copper company, will sell from New York for Europe May 6th, to transfer Anaconda to a syndicate representing the Rothschilds. The deal is said to have been in progress some time. The price reported as agreed upon for the mines is \$25,000,000. No confirmation is obtainable.

The Sale Contradicted.

NEW YORK, April 28.—The press of this city have no confirmation of the rumored sale of the Anaconda mine to the Rothschilds.
