ABOUT THE BRIDGE.

An Unfortunate and Malicious Article Published in a Brownsville Paper.

The Editor of the Herald.

A communication taken from the Brownsville Times, but whose malicious author resides in Albany, and is well known, was published in the Democrat Monday evening, which needs correction. It is amazing that any respectable paper would publish such base falsehoods as the article contains, and it seems more surprising that an Albany paper would give circulation to such misstatement of facts, especially without any comment what ever. The same article, we learn, was offered for publication to other Albany papers, but was refused because of its misrepresentations. The facts in the matter are that the whole bridge question has been conducted fairly, openly and above board. After the voters of Albany had decided by their ballots in favor of bonding the city to aid in building a free wagon bridge, along with other public improvements, the city council set about commencing this important work. Mayor Cowan, acting under a vote of the council, appointed a committee of three citizens, one from each ward, who represent the interests of the different parts of the city. Judge L. Flinn was appointed from the first ward, but declined. The committee was then appointed as follows: First ward, S. E. Young; second ward, Dr. C. W. Maston; third ward, A. Hackleman. This committee, with the mayor and city council and the county court not as a joint committee to hear the report of the engineer, who had been employed to make a survey of the river, and to select the site and the style of the bridge. After viewing the plans and hearing the report of the engineers this joint committee then proceeded to select a site, and knowing that a high free bridge is the only kind needed by the people of Albany and the county, California's need, the only site where such a structure could be built, was selected by a vote of seven to five, the county judge voting with the majority. The evident object of the writer of the article is to change public sentiment by misrepresentations and to thwart the will of the people by substituting for a high steel bridge, as first agreed upon, a cheap draw-bridge which will entail an endless expense of from \$2000 to \$3000 annually upon the tax-payers of the city and county for the benefit of a few property holders. Here is where the "manipulation" was attempted, but has signally failed. Will the people tolerate such schemes or be content that an annual tax of \$3000 be fastened upon them for all time to come? The accusation that the committee appointed were directly interested in locating the bridge at Calapooia street is a malicious falsehood. Mr. Hackleman is known to be the heaviest property holder in the lower ward, while Mayor Cowan owns five times as much in the lower ward as he does in the first. Dr. Maston has no property in that end of town, and Mr. Young's property is in the middle ward. Hence the malicious charge falls flat, did it need any refutation of the base accusation that these gentlemen would stoop to the dishonorable methods with which they are charged in the scurrilous article in question. It is not only the intent of the article to slander well known citizens who have lived here for years and helped to make of Albany a prosperous city, but to intensify public feeling upon the question of the location in the hope of defeating the bridge altogether. But their purposes are well known, and we will have a bridge. It is the sentiment of the people that a high free wagon bridge at Albany this summer, and the "manipulation" from the alleged Brownsville correspondent will not be allowed to prevent its construction. We regret that the editor of the Democrat, who pretends to have been in favor of a bridge, should have suffered himself to be imposed upon by a malicious scribbler with such base purposes as the defeat of the bridge. A MIRACULOUS ESCAPE.

A Young Lady Dragg'd Half a Block by a Frightened Horse.

Miss Mollie Ludwig had a miraculous escape from being dragged to death by a runaway horse in this city Sunday. Miss Ludwig and Miss Taylor, who reside near the Calapooia bridge about a mile and a half east of town were driving down Sixth street in a dog cart and met a team at the bridge on Vine street across the Santiam canal. In attempting to pass they drove so close to the side that one wheel went up the slanting banister turning the cart over and frightening the horse causing it to runaway. Miss Ludwig's foot caught in the bottom of the cart and she was dragged half a block under the cart before the horse was finally run into a brush pile along the sidewalk and stopped by some young men. The young lady was extricated from the cart and taken to the residence of Dr. J. L. Hill. Examination revealed the fact that her left arm was dislocated at the elbow and the wrist sprained. She was bruised very badly, but notwithstanding her escape from a horrible death is truly miraculous, considering the circumstances. Miss Taylor was thrown out on the bridge, but escaped with slight injury.

THE CUSHING ROBBERIES.

They Sold Between \$9000 and 10,000 Worth of Freight.

The Oregonian prints the following in regard to the Cushing car robberies, who ran a cheap cash store in Albany a short time ago and were arrested in Nebraska. The most trustworthy estimate of the loss of freight to the Union and Northern Pacific Railroad Companies through the thievery of the Cushing-Frank and his wife Tita, nee Patches, and Adam and his wife Eliza, is that they have recovered part of their stolen goods, but the thieves sold a good store of them, and what they could not sell they destroyed. They could find no use for an \$800 clock, and did not dare sell it, for fear it would lead to their detection, so they threw it into Puget sound. The Cushing's operated on the Union Pacific between Elsen and Portland and on the North on the Elsen between Elsenburgh and Tacoma. There is no doubt in the minds of the railroad officials that they were in league with railroad employees, and they are determined to ferret out these employees and see that they are summarily punished. This was a nefariously planned case of hats from a car in Albany and to save himself from the penitentiary, turned state's evidence. At the examination of Jones he exposed the Cushing's. Immediately the Northern Pacific proceeded against Frank and Tita Cushing, but seeing that the Port and detectives had taken the initiative, decided to let them finish the job. For awhile the gang made South Bend on Gray Harbor their headquarters. And later, Cushing's house was the place of concealment of goods stolen from the Northern Pacific. Here the gang met and planned and divided their profits. Some of the goods were shipped to Cedar Rapids, Neb. Adam and Eliza had a store at Albany, Or., and sold all the goods and shipped more to Cedar Rapids. Adam and Eliza are now in jail at Albion, Neb. They have applied for a writ of habeas corpus, and Deputy Sheriff William Morgan of Portland, is waiting for the court to decide the case.
