The national indebtedness is a
matter of interest and concern, but
in comparison with other nations
ours is not a matter of much
solicitude. For the purposes of
comparison the census bureau has

obtained statements of the public
debt of most of the nations of the
world, and is able to show the in-
crease or decrease in the last ten
years in the case of the most im-
portant countries. In this com-
parison the United States makes
an extremely favorable appearance
even if national, state, and county
debts are all lumped together. The
aggregate indebtedness of the
foreign nations heard from very
nearly doubled from 1880 to 1890,
while that of the United States
was reduced nearly one-half. The
strictly national debt was reduced
more than one-half, while that of
the states was somewhat dimi-
nished, and that of the countries
slightly increased, though not in
proportion to the increase of popu-
lation. The comparison of public
indebtedness per capita of the
population is very favorable to
the United States. In France it
amounts to \$116.35; in the Nether-
lands, \$95.56; in Great Britain,
\$87.79; in Italy, \$76.06. In the
United States the national debt
per capita is \$14.63, or, including
state and county debts, \$20.46.
This does not include the strictly
local indebtedness of towns and
municipalities, but that is in no
wise represented in the public
debt of foreign nations, and should
not be included for the purpose of
comparison. The whole world
seems to be pretty nearly \$50,000-
000,000 in debt, but its assets are
doubtless sufficient to keep it
from the perils of bankruptcy for
some time to come.
