THE MAN SNEAKED INTO THE ROOM While the Mother Was out and Accomplished His Designs. SEATTLE, June 11.—John Cowberry, a salesman aged 29, was arrested this morning, upon the charge of rape upon the person of a 14-year-old girl named Maude Child. The girl was sick and in the care of her mother in the Roeblock on Front street between Stewart and Virginia. The man sneaked in the sickroom while the mother was out and accomplished his base designs on the girl.

ACCIDENTAL DEATH. A Bullet Enters the Heart of a Baltimore Woman. BALTIMORE, Md., June 11.—Mrs. Stuart Kearney, the widow of the private secretary to President Walcott, was shot and instantly killed while getting some linen from a bureau drawer late Tuesday night. The pistol was lying in the drawer, and the theory is that the weapon became entangled in the clothing, and was discharged. The bullet entered the breast in the region of the heart, and death followed almost immediately. No one was in the room at the time. The idea of suicide is not entertained, as Mrs. Kearney was a very amiable disposition, and had a very pleasant summer house at Skyeville. She was 24 years of age, and had one child.

PRECIOUS STONES STOLEN. NEW YORK, June 11.—The fact has just come to light, says a morning paper, that the mammoth establishment of Hilton, Hughes & Deming was entered on last Friday night and \$10,000 or more worth of diamonds in the jewelry department taken. The fact was kept secret with the intention of catching the burglars, but so far they are unable to do so.

THE DISPUTE SETTLED AMICABLY. LONDON, June 11.—A dispatch from Mozambique says that officials of Portugal and the British government have settled in an amicable manner the question in dispute as to the navigation of the Pungwa river, the waters of which the Portuguese would not open to the British.

RAIN IN CALIFORNIA. SAN FRANCISCO, June 11.—Light showers of rain have been falling since last evening. The precipitation amounts to seven-hundredths of an inch. Rain is reported from over fifty railroad stations in California, varying from two hundredths to one and twenty-five-hundredths.

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
