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W'KINLEY IS THE MAN

Foraker Names as the Nominee For Governor.

OHIO WILL ELECT HIM.

Salient Reasons for Electing Him—Leading Men to Be Proud of Nominating a Unionist by Acclamation.

COLUMBUS, June 17.—The second day of the republican convention opened with prayer, after which the report of the committee on credentials was presented and adopted. The committee on permanent organization reported the name of General Bushnell for permanent chairman of the convention. His address was brief. Nominations were then decided in order, and ex-governor Foraker arose to present the name of Wm. McKinley for governor. When he appeared the delegates fairly went wild with enthusiasm. He said: "Gentlemen of the convention: I have now the most pleasing duty to perform. This contest upon which we are about to enter is to be in some respects an unusual character. Not only is the governorship of Ohio at stake, but the contest involves more than the general assembly, more than the public institutions. It reaches into national politics. He then enumerated reasons for the course to be pursued in giving preference to the nomination of General Harrison, James G. Blain, Senator Sherman, Charles Foster, and adding: "Ohio is the lookout mountain of political battles upon which we are entering, and William McKinley, Jr., is the Joe looker of the republican party, and we are the boys who intend to follow him up his steep and rugged mountain sides, and help him plant the flag of republicanism in triumph there, and next year, inspired by this glorious achievement, all the columns from Maine to Oregon will be turned against the enemy; and as to them it will be Bragg in 1862. Their lines will be broken, and before the resistless onslaught they will be swept back into the depths of defeat and despair.
