SINKER, Owyhee Co., June 15. We have been having the most lovely wetfoot weather for some time.

The orchards give promise of an abundance of fruit and especially of peaches, prunes and other fruits of their kind.

There was a storm of hail passed over here in May in which hailstones as large as blackbird eggs were quite common.

This season has been very propitious so far for grain and vegetables, but somewhat too wet for alfalfa as the greater portion has fallen down, and will be very hard to cut.

Haying will commence as soon as the weather clears up sufficiently to allow of its curing properly.

Range stock are said to be doing nicely this year, there being plenty of grass in the mountains, but down on the foothills there is nothing but white sage, sagebrush, greasewood and sagebush.
