It is respect to future railroad travel, the New York Herald suggests that this little planet is about twenty-four thousand miles in circumference, and within a score of years we shall probably be able to make over twenty thousand miles of the journey in a palace car.

We shall start, say, from Boston, and follow the sun to San Francisco. There we shall be switched off on the line which will run through British Columbia to some port in Alaska—a line which even so conservative a railroad man as Charles Francis Adams prophesies will be in operation before the baby who is now cutting his first tooth celebrates his twenty-first birthday.

At Alaska we will take a short trip by water and reach the eastern terminus of the Siberian railway in a few hours. From that point we shall skirt the northern boundaries of China and India, just graze Afghanistan and enter Russia in Europe stop over at St. Petersburg for a night's rest. Then will come Berlin, Paris and London. The czar is pushing the Siberian railway with great vigor. Half the distance to the Pacific has already been covered. When paying mines are developed in Alaska, as they will be, we shall connect that territory to the states by the continuous whistle of locomotives. With these two lines in operation we can do the twenty-one thousand miles with ease and comfort and the other three thousand across the Atlantic by steamer in five days, or possibly less. That is something to look forward to.

It is just a little bit difficult to fully imbibe what the significance, aims and objects were of the so called states picnic at Salem, on the 4th of July. If it had any significance at all it was in the direction of keeping alive a state's pride in the breast of each one participating. A sort of state-rights patriotism. In that view of the case the expression of the principal orator of the occasion, Col. Robert A. Miller, that such picnics should supersede Fourth of July celebrations was a little bit off. This country is one and indivisible and the Fourth of July helps to keep it so and that occasion should not be superseded by any picnic arrangement the teaching of which will lead to fostering state pride above a national pride.

In reading dissertations upon the punishment of crime, one cannot but conjecture if it is a fact that two wrongs make a right. For instance: a man commits murder, which is classed as the greatest crime of all; the state, acting as an individual, kills the murderer—in fact commits a second murder. Does the two wrongs make a right? And on the point of the most heinous crime; an individual by his acts constantly denominated sowing wild oats contracts physical infirmities and transmits them in such a manner as to cause physical infirmity, deformity and suffering to numerous individuals, even unto the third and fourth generation. Which is the greater crime, that or murder. The wrecking of innumerable lives or the shortening of a few years of a single life.

GEN. WALKER, in the July Forum, addresses the fact that the negro population of this country, in proportion to the white population is decreasing in numbers, and puts forth the theory that as a race they will continue to decrease. He is of the opinion that the race will eventually be gathered into the low hot countries bordering upon the gulf, where they are adapted to live and while men are not, and in this manner the race problem will be effectively settled.

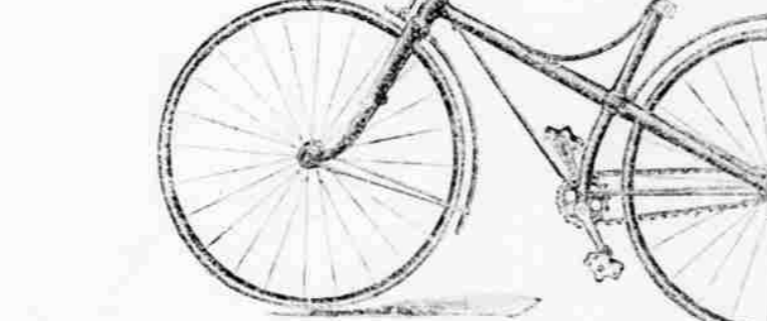
