THE REASON FOR IT. Astorian: Butter is sold in an eccentric fashion in California and

some parts of Oregon. The producer markets the butter in rolls supposed to weigh two pounds. The dealer sells it by the roll and charges for two pounds, but the roll always lacks from six to eight ounces of full weight. This thing has been going on for years. To the loss of the consumer, and without profit to any one except the middleman. The middleman buys butter by the pound and sells it by the roll, so he makes a clear profit on the short weight. When a dealer handles several tons of butter a day this shortage makes a large item, for on each roll he will make from eight to ten cents, or at least \$100 on every ton. The buyers can't detect this, as if they made butter in good two-pound rolls, no commission man would handle it.

Thought It was No Good. Corvallis Gazette: Brady Barrett was seriously burned about the hands and face last Wednesday by the premature explosion of a lot of gun powder. He had become impressed with the idea that the powder was worthless and to test it he took a lighted match to it. It took only a moment to convince him that it was of first quality, for it made such an impression on his face and hands, and perhaps on his mind, that he will carry the scars through life. He is getting along as well as could be expected under the circumstances but he will have to wear bandages for several days yet.

A DASTARDLY ATTEMPT TO WRECK A TRAIL DISCOVERED. NEWTON, N. Y., July 11.-The fact has just leaked out that a thoroughly-planned though unsuccessful attempt to wreck a train on the West Shore railroad was recently made. On Monday, Section Foreman Telen, whose territory extends from Junction Point West Haverstraw, was making an examination of the tracks near the former station, he was startled to discover that somebody had wedged a piece of steel rail in between the rails, so that the train would not pass. A large spike had also been driven in between the piece of rail referred to and the outer rail of the down track. The obstructions were removed by Telen before the arrival of the first train.

A PENSION FOR DON PEDRO. The Movement to Make Him an Allowance Gaining Strength. LONDON, July 11.-Rio Janeiro dispatch says that there is a growing public desire to renew the allowance to Don Pedro, the ex-emperor, on the same terms and for the same amount as when he abdicated the throne. This allowance has been withheld on the ground that Don Pedro had abandoned his claim to the throne, and was still at work, in a quiet way, trying to renew his power in Brazil. For some time past it has been evident that Don Pedro had altogether surrendered any idea of the restoration of a monarchy in Brazil, and therefore the movement to renew his pension is rapidly gaining ground.

Legal and Moral Rights. Seattle Telegraph: The legal right of a corporation to hire whom it pleases is undeniable; the legal right of a laborer to work for whomsoever wants him is clear. A corporation has a legal right to discharge its men without a day's notice; and the men who have a legal right to quit a man's employ without any notice. These legal rights being admitted, there remain moral and equitable considerations. The corporation which should discharge its men without notice, and the men who should quit work without notice, would not be observing the equities, would not be acting honorably. If either side deceives the other as to its purposes, that is not honorable, if either side fails to keep its promises, that is not morally defensible. The state can only deal with the legal aspect of labor troubles; public opinion, however, will deal with the moral aspect.

San Francisco Veterans at Home. SAN FRANCISCO, July 11.-The steamer Oregon, Captain P. J. Leman, arrived yesterday from Portland, bringing the Veteran firemen from their visit to the Northwest. They were met at Spear street wharf by a delegation of friends and a brass band and escorted up town. They all speak highly of their visit. One of the members of the trip is one mounted elk's head, which was presented them by the Veteran of Portland.

People Starving in Russia. ST. PETERSBURG, July 11.-Sufferings of the people from famine in the Volga region are becoming intense. The provincial assembly at Kasan reports 40,000 persons without food.
