RIVERS AND HARBORS

A number of reports from engineer officers in charge of river and harbor improvements have just been made public by the war department.

The coming congress is committed, so far as the democratic press can speak for it, to a policy of retirement and reform.

It is noticeable, however, that all the advocates of retrenchment show a fine scorn for matters of detail.
