TRADE IS IMPROVING.

It is gratifying to note the improvement in the condition of business and trade throughout the country.

Bradstreet's reports indicate a growing effect of the increased activity in staple lines, due to the anticipation of wants during the autumn.

Crop reports are most satisfactory, railroad traffic is increasing, and the gold which has been exported in such large amounts will soon begin to come back in pay for grain.

The following is last Sunday's New York Herald's financial article: "The movement of currency to the west has fairly begun, but has not yet reached very large proportions, as it is evident from the increase of surplus reserve with city banks shown by yesterday's statement. It does not, of course, reflect the \$1,500,000 gold exported yesterday morning. The treasury machinery has been utilized for the transfer of \$1,570,000 currency during the week to Cincinnati and Chicago, and at latter point New York funds are now at a discount of 50 per cent \$1,000, a rate which indicates a sharp efflux from this center. The movement of grain already presents some new features. Recent talk of direct exports of grain from Texas to Europe has crystallized in the engagement of 80,000 bushels of wheat from Galveston next week direct to Cork. New Orleans is prepared for a heavy export trade, and the barge line from St. Louis

to that port has continued for every boat up to November 1. At San Francisco more than three hundred and fifty vessels are under charter to load with grain. Two of these are for South America and one for Australian colonies, a fact which is supposed to indicate a shortage there.

The sky of Europe is black with rumors of serious complications. There is little danger of war, but while Russia and France are patching up an alliance and foreign nations generally are engaged in blinding each other the people of this country are industriously harvesting big crops and we can afford to keep in good humor as the markets for our products abroad are strengthened by all such bellicose demonstrations.

The Albany fair grounds should be improved, and a county fair inaugurated. Linn county has some of the best horses in the state, and the other fine stock and agricultural products ought to be put on exhibition where they can be seen by the public. They cannot be excelled, and are a standing advertisement of the wonderful resources of the great Willamette Valley whenever exposed to view.

The collision in Japanese waters which sent 200 men to their death is the greatest disaster that has happened in the Orient since the foundering of the Turkish frigate Ertugroul. In this recent case it is plain that a panic seized upon passengers and crew, and in the confusion many lives were needlessly wasted.
