RAILROAD COMMISSION.

The Effect of the Diligent Work of the Board.

Through total ignorance, or from a partisanship that cares for no other party than to gain a success for its party, there are many papers throughout the state that are inveighing against the railroad commission, and parroting Governor Pennoyer's cry for its abolition. That there is a call for some power to stand between the people on the one side and the railroad power to charge all there is in the traffic on the other side, every individual who knows anything about the subject knows and acknowledges. And further it has been conceded that a well-equipped and properly supported commission can best supply that need, (Governor Pennoyer to the contrary notwithstanding. The question resolves itself into one point then: shall the present efficient railroad commission receive the support and encouragement that will sustain it in its laudable work, or will the supposed changes for partisan advantage cause the clogging of the work and the hindering of the accomplishment of any good? The cry is raised that the commission are doing no good and hold sincere offices. But do those who raise that cry know what they are talking about? No; or else they willfully prevaricate for partisan purposes only. In the first place the commission has carefully, laboriously and intelligently inspected every line of railroad in the state, and made requirements for repairs and improvements, that have been followed up and performed by the companies which may have several accidents, perhaps, that would have been as fatal as the Lake Labish affair. These benefits, of course, cannot be appreciated for they are not in sight, but they are nevertheless substantial and of great worth. In the second place the commission have been hard at work upon the passenger and freight rates, to get them regulated to the best interests of the public. In one little particular, where they caused the Union Pacific road to correct their passenger schedules running into and out of Portland, they have made a difference in the fares to passengers that will more than cover their salaries. Then the last schedules of freight rates that they have prepared for the Southern Pacific lines, which promise to go into effect at the time set, the 1st of September, will save many thousands of dollars to the producers of the country. The schedules make a reduction of 10 per cent. on wheat, flour and feed, and even greater reductions on other commodities. The railroad may contest the matter and attempt to delay until after the present crop is over, but the prospect is that they will not, for if they do the outcome for them will be unpleasant in nature, but it will simply mean that the next legislative action will be a maximum rate bill, and a further reduction in the passenger tariff. It is not wise to monkey with a buzz saw, and the feelings of the people are just at that point, where it will take but little more to set in motion a buzz saw that will cut and slash in a fearful manner. A cool judgment and a wise course on the part of the railroad officials at this time may avert much trouble in the future.

He is a very quiet fellow and seems to make the best of his situation. He disclaims to have had anything to do with the murder, but says he thinks the lowest man committed the crime. The murdered man is an uncle to the prisoner.

OREGON PACIFIC MEN.

Their Appeal for Their Wages to Be Speedily Acted Upon.

The proceedings instituted by the employes of the O. P. R. R. Co. to compel the receiver to pay them for their services the past six months, came to a hearing before Judge Shattuck at Corvallis yesterday. The further consideration of the matter was set for Tuesday at 2 o'clock p. m., when the same will be heard at Corvallis and in all probability will be terminated. It is sincerely to be hoped the matter will result favorably to the men. They have worked faithfully and well, and common justice dictates an early settlement for wages long past due.

NOTES FROM SIUSLAW.

Our Regular Correspondent Dishes Up the Late Events.

WALTON, Or., Aug. 11. Since writing last, quite a number of events have occurred that were worthy of note, but being so busy with my hay crop and other matters I have not had time to note the events in their season.

The Rev. Kelms passed through our settlement making a visit to the coast. On his way down he stopped at Walton, from July 16th, to 20th, and preached seven sermons, and on his return July 26th he preached two sermons, and during the series of meetings he baptized thirteen, and organized a church of about forty-six members. We have Sunday school, social meeting and Christian Endeavor Society on each Sunday, so our Sundays are the busiest day of the week.

July 24th, the Chirahomony, and Walton schools, joined in an exhibition and school picnic, which was very largely attended and the best of order prevailed, good music, good order, good dinner, good declamations and the picnic was a grand success.

On last Saturday the neighbors took the Barbour family by surprise, by about twenty-five going in on them unawares, taking their dinner with them and having the Barbours to act as their guest. Again we had excellent music, good singing and a good dinner, and a good time generally. Aaron says he would like to be surprised that way again.

In the meantime the devil is getting in his work. A young man that claimed to belong to a family in merry old England, but now styles himself, the cow boy (a disgrace to the cow) came into the Christian Endeavor meeting with a broad brimmed hat on his head, a vile cigarette between his lips, and a very large, murderous looking revolver strapped across his hip; afterward he went down the river ten miles below here to a dance at Jason Nealy's and got in a row with some one and drew that murderous looking revolver, but it proved to be empty. Mrs. Shuman is well. Wise's little girls were in the house at the time. Noae were hurt.

SCHOOL FUND APPORTIONED.

A Large Increase in the Number of Children of a School Age.

Wednesday State Treasurer Metcaben made the annual apportionment of the interest arising from the common school fund. This money is distributed in the several counties of this state on the March census of children in the counties between the ages of 4 and 10 years. The number of persons in the state of this age is 104,622 and the total amount thus apportioned by the state school land board is \$153,151.90, being \$1.45 for each person of school age. The increase in number of children of school age reported by the census of 1891 is 6,055 greater than the number reported in 1890 and the increase in the sum apportioned is \$8,779.75.
