The council have been trying for three months to elect a night watch. They took five or six ballots again last night, with the same result. There are three or four applicants for the position and a majority of the council cannot agree upon a man. In the meantime the city is paying a salary for a dissatisfied service.—Corvallis Times.

CHARGED WITH MURDER.

The North Carolina Sheriff Arrives for the Man in Jail.

Yesterday Sheriff Pittman, of Robeson county, and Col. McKim, of Laurens county, N. C., arrived here after the man McDougall, who was arrested by Sheriff Scott, charged with murdering his uncle in the said Robeson county.

McDougall was a merchant in Laurens county and his uncle lived in the country near by. It appears that some person blackened to represent a colored man, enticed the old gentleman into a field on pretext of learning the way to a place near by, and at the same time the man was found in the field where he had been murdered.

Suspicion attached to McDougall because smut was noticed on his face, and also because he had a power of attorney from his aunt to collect the insurance on his uncle's life. McDougall was abandoned and was not discovered until a letter written home gave away where he was located. The sheriff and his deputy have the requisite extradition papers.

NEWS OF THE COAST.

Interesting Items from Exchanges Throughout the Northwest.

The hot winds of the past two weeks in Tillamook county have damaged to some extent the crops in that section. Fall wheat is, of course, uninjured, but spring wheat that was at all late has suffered severely.

In some instances where the wheat had not commenced to harden before the hot winds came the crop is entirely blighted and will not even make good hay. The Fossil Journal declares that no matter what the season may be in that country it has been satisfactorily proven that a fall-sown crop is the only sure crop in the country, and farmers should govern themselves accordingly.

The Roseburg Review says: Our peach crop is going to wait for want of a fruit canner. The fruit growers of the county may wake up to the importance of such an enterprise after this year.

The Gold Beach Gazette says this has been the greatest fishing season ever known on Rogue river. The catch has been immense. Grants Pass Courier: Georgie, the two-year old boy of Fred Benson, was drowned in a spring on his father's place near Kerby on Sunday afternoon. It appears the child had been playing with an uncle of his, twelve years old, and they had both been absent some time from the house and when search was instituted the lifeless body of the infant was found in the spring. Fred Benson came in Monday morning for the coffin after riding all night. He, with his family and brother-in-law, were camped on the brother's place at the time of the accident.

Ira Adams, of Salem, while returning from hunting near Turner in climbing over a fence near W. T. Van Scoy's, the gun was discharged, shooting off the hand at the wrist. The allotment of land among the Indians on the Unatilla reservation is progressing smoothly and there have been few disputes for the commissioners to decide. The Indians are not so prone to dispute as their white brothers, says the Pendleton East-Oregonian. If two want the same piece of land one of the other withdraws, with the remark: "You take this and I'll get another." White men, under the same circumstances, would probably fight figuratively speaking, until the last grasp, for supremacy.

Under Suspicion. An Exchange says that a prominent rancher of Grant county, named John Austin, and his man, John Guthridge, were arrested in Pendleton Sunday evening, charged with the larceny of a steer. The men were just about to ship thirty-six head of cattle from the Union Pacific stockyards at Pendleton. Suspicion attached to them because seven head of them bore the Lux & Miller brand, and this firm is not in the habit of selling cattle in small lots. It is also claimed that several other brands have been seen among the bunch and that the men acted as if they wished to make a hurried shipment and avoid attention. Austin claims he bought the cattle from several persons in the John Day country. The men were committed to the county jail pending an examination.

Went to Portland. Salem Statesman: The Three Sisters went down to Portland yesterday morning with a small load of freight. A good many passengers were taken below, several of them going to St. Paul to work on the convent. The boat-stage continues just passable for vessels of light draft, but with a little work on the part of the snagboat they could get along without any trouble. A few snags need pulling and if several of the worst bars were scraped navigation would be decidedly easier.

Flies Cloth. A web of cloth upon L. E. Blain's counter, yesterday evening attracted much attention. It was a perfect fine specimen of cassimere or broadcloth as was ever imported from France or any other country, and it was the product of the Albany Woolen Mills. Home work takes the lead.

THE COUNTY JAIL.

It is Only a Matter of a Few Days Work for a Prisoner to Escape.

What is the matter with Linn county jail? If a prisoner gets tired of his abode it is only a matter of a few hours of work and he is out in the world again. W. W. Saunders dug his way out and it took \$1,500 to get him back again—enough to construct cages from which no living man could escape.

Others have escaped and once but for perjury of a prisoner a wholesale jail break would have been recorded a few years ago. The hinges on which the iron doors hang were sawed off and it only remained to lift the door aside and walk out. But one of the prisoners gave the plan away and the thing was nipped at the last moment. Why cannot cells be put in the jail, so that when a man goes in there is some guarantee that he is going to stay, without being watched day and night.

The sheriff of Linn county has manifold duties that require his attention, and cannot be kept here and everywhere and keep his eye on our makeshift jail. Is it not false economy to pay out a \$1000 or more every two or three years to capture escaped criminals when that amount would make escape impossible if properly used.

The county commissioners examined the jail about a week before the last escape was made, and yet two prisoners walked out, leaving only an old case knife with teeth notched in it to tell the tale. If a prisoner can gain his liberty so easily it is high time something was done.

A Poor Waif. Rockford Enterprise: The steamer Stella, on Medical Lake, tied a few feet from the water's edge at the landing Monday night, and a little castaway to sleep while all Medical Lake slept—except an unfortunate woman. The son of Mr. William Miller, the owner of the steamer, discovered the waif when he went to the boat early in the morning to fire up. It was a new-born boy, wrapped in a black shawl and was not larger than a loaf of bread. Pinned to the shawl was the following letter, written in a feminine hand evidently: "Kind boatman, will you please be kind enough to take this little infant to the orphan asylum at Spokane? Within the shawl is \$5. If I all I have. If the child dies place a notice in the Spokane Review so that I may know of it. If it lives and I am ever able I will take it and be a mother to it." Later the infant was taken to the Spokane orphanage, and finally its mother, a Mrs. Brown, made herself known.
