The matter of capital punishment, in one of its numerous phases, was brought to public notice in the case that has just been brought to light in Beatrice, Nebraska...

Four years ago the people of Beatrice, out in Nebraska, witnessed the hanging of John Marion...

He and Cameron had been together on a wagon trip fifteen years ago. Cameron was not seen again and some years after a body was found and the conclusion was that it was the body of Cameron...

Marion's friends, who did not believe he could be guilty of the murder, fought the case desperately, but four years ago the last court upheld verdict of murder in the first degree and Marion was hanged...

Mr. Wynore, Marion's uncle, was so well convinced of Marion's innocence that he did not cease to search for Cameron, even after Marion was hanged. He has just found the murdered man alive and well in a Kansas town. Here is an innocent man hanged, a family disgraced, perhaps wife and children deprived of support...

Under the Wisconsin law, Marion would have been sent to prison for life, and on the discovery of his innocence some reparations would have been possible. In the case of a guilty man, life imprisonment protects the public; in a case where subsequent testimony establishes innocence, the public is not powerless to do something to repair its error.

If the element of revenge could be entirely eliminated from all influence in the matter, capital punishment would cease to exist at once. Certainly it should have no influence but that it does must be apparent to every thinking person who considers the subjects in all its bearings.
