DROWNING AT GRANT'S PASS.
White in Bathing Two Young Men Lose Their Lives.

GRANT'S PASS, OR., Aug. 21.—Yesterday two cases of drowning occurred on the Rogue river. Between 5 and 6 p. m. three young men were in bathing in the river, north of town by the White rocks, viz.: Bert W. Hammond, Kenneth Root and Blodgett. The three attempted to swim across the river and Bert Hammond, who was the best swimmer, was the first to be taken by the current. He was seen to be struggling and the others thought he was joking. But when they turned back they found he had drowned. They immediately went for a boat and got him out, but it was too late to bring him to life again.

Federal services take place this morning at the Methodist church. He came from Colorado about two years ago, and was 23 years of age. He owned a fine ranch, but had no relatives in this section of the country.

Mr. J. W. Holmes, of Grant's Pass, who lives in the northern part of town, lost his barn and outbuildings by fire between 11 and 12 o'clock yesterday, losing in all about eight tons of hay, four horses, two cattle, four hogs, harness, farming utensils, etc., to the amount of \$1200. His house, only thirty feet away, was saved. He thinks the fire was caused by a pipe in one of the outbuildings, getting a match and setting it alight. No insurance.

On Saturday evening at 10:15 o'clock a fire broke out at Mr. B. Williams' dwelling, located just north of Gilbert creek on North Main street, but with our new fire department the fire was confined to this one building. The loss was about \$1,000. The cause of the fire could not be learned.

ANOTHER DROWNING.
GOLD HILL, Aug. 21.—Johnnie, the 15-year-old son of J. K. Moore, of Sam's valley, while trying to save his brother Ben from drowning in the Rogue river today, was himself drowned by 2 1/2 years of age. Mr. Howard, formerly a salesman for Fleischner, Mayer & Co., brought the body out of the water in twenty minutes after the drowning, but all efforts to resuscitate him proved of no avail.

PORTLAND, Aug. 21.—At the laying of the corner stone of University Park this afternoon by Bishop Fitzgerald, a large number of ministers and laymen from various parts of the state were present. This is the corner stone of the first of several buildings which the trustees propose to erect in the early future, and is the beginning of a great institution.
