THE EUROPEAN SITUATION.
The articles in Harper's Magazine for September by De Blowitz, the able Paris correspondent of the London Times, is attracting very general attention. The subject of the article is the condition of affairs in Europe, and it is probable that no one is better qualified for a discussion of that topic than M. de Blowitz.

Contrary to the generally received opinion, the writer does not think that war will come between France and Germany, primarily, although he admits that there is an abundance of hostility and bad blood on each side to generate a war. He says that, in his opinion, a general war is inevitable, but not imminent, and he fixes the date of the beginning of such a war at the death of Francis Joseph, Emperor of Austria-Hungary, whenever that may occur.

The retold story of the death of the Crown Prince Rudolph, the only direct heir to the throne of Austria-Hungary, tends additional force and interest to De Blowitz' article. In his judgment the two princes who stand next in the line of succession are weaklings and little better than madmen, it being a question which is the better, but which is the worst. De Blowitz says that the death of Francis Joseph will be a catastrophe which will cause an inevitable, fatal and general war, in which Austria must lose her national identity, and political changes take place which even he does not venture to predict in their entirety.

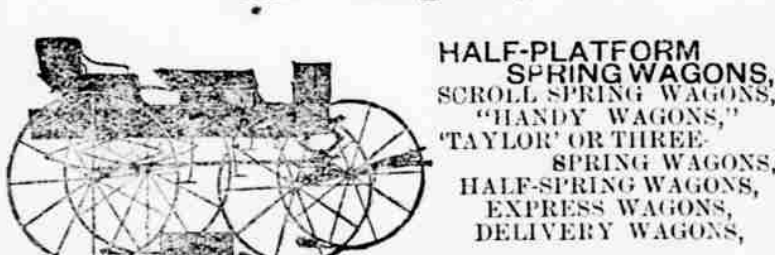
