Since then idle machinery has resumed activity, and new mills are now in process of construction. It seems to be probable that the design of the tariff to transfer the manufacture of woolsens needed in America to this country will be accomplished."

Australia, and that great continent will ere long be traversed from south to north by a line of rails which will penetrate vast regions still unpeopled and largely unexplored. Nearly 600 miles of the line have been completed from Port Adelaide north to Angle Pool, while on the north end a road has been built from Port Darwin south to Pine Creek, leaving a gap of about 1,100 miles, which will be reduced over 400 miles this year by construction from both ends.

Speculating in the grain and breadstuffs of the country, where it is carried on by attempting to fluctuate the price fictitiously, is a crime, and should be so considered and treated.
