THE PREVENTION OF CRIME.

An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure, is a trite old saying that has passed into one of the world's axioms. To apply this prevention in the criminal actions of human beings is one of the problems of the day that attracts attention, and calls for most earnest action. The Boston Journal says that among the various means of prevention of vice and crime, the associations which discuss questions of prison reform and which aim to influence legislation in favor of prison improvements are useful aids toward progress. Of these, the Howard Association in England is the most famous. Formed twenty-five years ago, with the chief object of the repression of crime by other means than mere imprisonment, it has accomplished a great work for humanity. A report read at its recent annual meeting gave an interesting survey of progress made during the last quarter of a century. Statistics giving the decrease of prisoners in England and Wales, notwithstanding the increase in population, were interpreted not as marks of actual reduction in crime, but rather as the application of better methods of dealing with crime than by mere imprisonment. The reformatories and industrial schools are modern institutions illustrating the improved methods of dealing with crime and are much commended by the Howard Association, for, according to the report, "it is much better to commit juvenile offenders, or neglected children, to such institutions than to goad with its lifelong stigma."

This error is not only made by persons of limited intelligence, but is gravely repeated by editors who ought to know better. They will probably assume that his election is equivalent to an endorsement of the new tariff act by the American people, and that as a consequence the McKinley bill will remain the law of the land for some time. Such an inference will be correct, although the free traders in the United States will not be inclined to assent to the correctness of the manner of arriving at the conclusion.

We might infer from the remarks of certain English journals that it is the duty of the United States to practice forbearance with insignificant nations like Chili, even though they heap insult upon us and kill our sailors. It may be a fine thing to be a great and powerful nation able to practice forbearance, but if the fruit of such a course is the heaping of indignities upon us which a smaller but more pugnacious nation would promptly resent, mighty little satisfaction will be derived from our greatness and power.
